AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

Fourth Amendment to Interlocal Agreement between King County S heriff's Office and the City of Bellevue Relating to Marine Patrol Services

The parties to the Interlocal Agreement between King County Sheriff's Office and the City of Bellevue Relating to Marine Patrol Services (Agreement) hereby amend said Agreement as follows:

- 4.1 Routine Marine Patrol Services. The City shall pay the County a share of the costs of marine patrol services allocated based on the city's portion of the overall County calls for services and on-view incidents and freshwater shoreline feet, as shown in Exhibit A to this Amendment (Exhibit A). The costs shall include direct costs, Sheriff's Office and County general overhead, less revenue received by the County for its share of the Vessel Registration Fee. Exhibit A reports adopted County bud geted costs and City charges for 2009. Both calls for service and cost shall be updated each calendar year. The calls for service for each year shall be those from the previous year's boating season. Cost will be based on the County's adopted bud get for marine patrol services and estimated boat tax revenue, for the succeeding year.
- 4.2 This amendment for 2009 is for an amount not to exceed \$58,173 as shown in Exhibit A. The County agrees to revise this amount annually following the King County Council's adoption of the Annual County budget. The County will provide the City by April 15 of the year for which the budget has been adopted a revised estimated agreement amount, if it is less than the amount shown in Exhibit A.
- 4.3 For 2009 the County shall bill the City quarterly for non-routine services (as described in Section 1.4) at the rate of approximately \$129 per hour per officer plus the \$50 hourly cost of the boat, starting at the time of call-out. The minimum call-out is two hours for two officers. Actual hourly rates, based on the adopted budget, shall be provided to the city by May 15 of each year. Should the services affect more than one jurisdiction, the County shall negotiate the allocation of the costs with the City and other affected jurisdictions.
- 4.4 The contract amount shall be billed as an annual amount in July 2009. Payment shall be made within 30 days after invoicing by the County.
- Any future amendments to this contract to update the annual Exhibit amount and hourly Marine Unit costs may be authorized by the King County Sheriff.

Said Amendment shall be effective May 1, 2009. All other provisions of the Agreement as previously amended remain unchanged.
