1 AN ORDINANCE amending the 2010 Budget Ordinance
2 relating to the department of transportation; and amending
3 the 2010 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 16717, Section 131,
4 as amended; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

6 SECTION 1. Findings:

7 A. Ordinance 16717, Section 131, Expenditure Restriction ER3 provides that
8 unless, by January 31, 2010, the executive has submitted a motion establishing a detailed
9 work plan for a regional stakeholder task force to consider a policy framework to guide
10 the growth and, if necessary, contraction of King County Metro Transit's system,
11 appropriation authority for \$1,800,000 shall lapse.

12 B. The Council has pending Proposed Motion 2009-0649, a motion to provide
13 guidance to the executive regarding the structure and charge of the regional stakeholder
14 task force.

15 C. The executive is working collaboratively with the council to develop a motion
16 and proposed work plan and task force membership, but members of the public have
17 requested additional time for review of these proposals so that executive transmittal of
18 the motion and work plan could not take account of this public comment and still meet
19 the January 31, 2010 deadline contained in the above referenced budget proviso.

20 D. In order to ensure that the task force is able to address policy concerns of the
21 citizens of King County in a thorough and comprehensive way, the council has
22 determined that extending the date for the proviso response is necessary to preserve the
23 public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing
24 public institutions.

25 E. In order for this ordinance to be effective prior to January 31, 2010, when the
26 expenditure authority for \$1,800,000 will lapse, it is necessary to enact this ordinance as
27 an emergency.

28 SECTION 2. Ordinance 16717, Section 131, as amended, is hereby amended by
29 adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

30 TRANSIT - From the public transportation fund for the 2010/2011 biennium
31 there is hereby appropriated to:

32 Transit \$0

33 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

34 Of this appropriation, \$1,800,000 may not be expended until the executive, following
35 transit division collaboration with a regional stakeholder task force, transmits an ordinance
36 amending the Transit Comprehensive Plan and Transit Strategic Plan to establish a framework to
37 guide the growth and, if necessary, contraction of King County's transit system.

38 Any plan and ordinance required to be submitted by this proviso must be filed in
39 the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the council, who
40 shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers and to the
41 committee coordinators for the physical environment committee, and the regional transit
42 committee or their successors. If the ordinance and recommendation is not filed by

43 December 15, 2010, appropriation authority shall lapse for the \$1,800,000 restricted by
44 this proviso.

45 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

46 Of this appropriation, \$350,000 shall be expended solely to support an audit of the transit
47 division conducted by the county. The likely areas of this audit include:

48 a. procurement of buses (analysis of process, criteria, financial and other analyses used
49 by the transit division);

50 b. vehicle maintenance staffing;

51 c. ride free area methodology;

52 d. additional review of the financial plan;

53 e. tracking of implementation of new (onboard) data systems and ORCA systems

54 (including business accounts); and

55 f. ACCESS Program staffing and efficient use of the ACCESS fleet.

56 ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

57 Of this appropriation, \$1,800,000 may not be expended until the executive
58 transmits a motion establishing a detailed work plan for a regional stakeholder task force
59 to consider a policy framework to guide the growth and, if necessary, contraction of King
60 County Metro Transit's system.

61 The work plan shall include a scope of work, tasks, schedule, milestones and the
62 budget and appointment criteria/process for municipal and community stakeholders, and
63 a coordinated staff working group.

64 The charge to the task force shall be to develop recommendations by September
65 2010 that will identify short term and long term objectives for transit service investment,
66 and formulate a service implementation policy implementing those objectives.

67 The motion and work plan for the regional stakeholder process required to be
68 submitted by this proviso must be filed in the form of a paper original and an electronic
69 copy with the clerk of the council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic
70 copy to all councilmembers and to the committee coordinator for the physical
71 environment committee or its successor. If the proposed motion and work plan are not
72 transmitted by ((~~January 31~~)) February 28, 2010, appropriation authority shall lapse for
73 the \$1,800,000 million restricted by this proviso.

74 ER4 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

75 Of this appropriation, \$275,000 shall be expended solely for the staffing and
76 support of a senior-level two-year temporary position, such as a Program/Project
77 Manager IV, focused on transit strategic planning outcomes as identified in the 2009
78 Transit Performance Audit Findings. The position shall be supervised jointly by the
79 transit general manager's office and the office of strategic planning and performance
80 management, but will be located in, and managed by, the office of strategic planning and
81 performance management.

82 P1 PROVIDED THAT:

83 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
84 executive transmits a report on fare evasion by April 30, 2010. The report shall provide an
85 estimate of the extent and cost of fare evasion based upon the results of an intensive, limited
86 duration, data collection effort that will involve a representative sampling of the entire system and
87 be conducted in collaboration with the transit operators. The report shall also include
88 recommended strategies to address fare evasion.

89 The report required to be submitted by this proviso must be filed in the form of a
90 paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the council, who shall retain the
91 original and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers and to the committee
92 coordinator for the regional transit committee and the physical environment committee or
93 their successors.

94 P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

95 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
96 executive transmits an ordinance to amend the Service Implementation Phasing Plan in the
97 Transit Strategic Plan to show when transit revenues are projected to recover sufficiently to allow
98 resumption of Transit Now service investments in Rapidly Developing Areas and the High
99 Ridership/Core Network and when the deferred 140,000-hour investment in that service will be
100 completed.

101 P3 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

102 The transit division may allow exterior advertising to cover bus side windows
103 only if at least a fifteen inch clear band of glass is maintained for the entire length of each
104 side of the bus. The transit division shall include in any agreement for exterior bus
105 advertising the bus wrap limitation contained in this proviso and shall also require that
106 any contractor include this restriction in any its subsequent exterior advertising
107 agreements with third parties.

108 P4 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

109 By September 1, 2010, the executive shall transmit a scope, schedule and work program
110 developed in collaboration with council, for a 2011 trolley replacement alternatives study that
111 identifies:

- 112 a. the alternative bus propulsion technologies to be evaluated;

- 113 b. the policy issues and choices associated with replacement alternatives;
- 114 c. provisions for public input; and
- 115 d. provisions for council input and monitoring.

116 The scope, schedule and work program required to be submitted by this proviso
117 must be filed in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the
118 council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all
119 councilmembers and to the committee coordinator for the physical environment
120 committee, or its successor.

121 P5 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

122 In coordination with the State Route 520 Urban Partnership Agreement and the
123 tolling of State Route 522, up to 5,000 annual bus service hours shall be delivered on
124 State Route 522, as supporting bus service to the core State Route 520 Urban Partnership
125 Agreement bus service, to mitigate the impacts of diversionary trips onto State Route
126 522.

127 The actual amount of service to be delivered shall be based on a corridor service
128 implementation plan transmitted by April 30, 2010, for adoption by ordinance. The
129 implementation plan shall: (1) be developed cooperatively with Sound Transit and
130 Washington state Department of Transportation to address peak and all day service
131 changes consistent with the State Route 520 Urban Partnership Agreement and the 520
132 Tolling Implementation Committee recommendations; (2) be integrated with Sound
133 Transit's bus service and Washington state Department of Transportation's tolling and
134 traffic management investments; (3) include at least 28,000 hours of core State Route 520
135 bus service; (4) consider transit service-related mitigation needs for State Route 520, I-

136 90, and State Route 522; and (5) include up to 5,000 annual bus service hours supporting
137 the core State Route 520 bus service, to mitigate the impacts of diversionary trips onto
138 State Route 522.

139 The plan and ordinance required to be submitted by this proviso must be filed in
140 the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the council, who
141 shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers and to the
142 committee coordinator for the physical environment committee, or its successor.

143 P6 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

144 The transit division shall undertake a fare coordination effort with, at a minimum,
145 Sound Transit, and other regional transit agencies if possible. The primary focus of that
146 effort should be implementation of the 2009 Transit Performance Audit's
147 recommendations regarding discounted youth and senior/disabled fares while also
148 addressing the question of parity between fare categories. The transit division shall
149 present a report on the status of that effort to the regional transit committee and physical
150 environment committee or its successor by April 30, 2010, and the executive shall
151 transmit recommended changes to fare policies or fares, or both by July 1, 2010.

152 P7 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

153 Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall not be expended or encumbered unless, by August
154 1, 2010, the transit division has transmitted and the council has accepted by motion a report
155 detailing the feasibility of implementing recycling and solar powered trash compaction at transit
156 passenger facilities maintained by King County. At a minimum, the report shall include:

157 1. A discussion of current and past recycling and compaction efforts at King County
158 buildings and their effectiveness;

159 2. A discussion of the number and location of passenger facilities that have waste
160 receptacles and options for a pilot program at a representative cross section of passenger
161 facilities; and

162 3. A detailed discussion of the potential for public-private partnerships that would make
163 implementation more cost-effective.

164 Furthermore, the report will provide options for implementing recycling and compaction
165 at King County passenger facilities and the executive's preferred alternative. By another proviso,
166 the facilities management division is to report on implementing recycling and compaction at King
167 County buildings. Therefore, the transit and facilities management divisions are directed to
168 collaborate and provide a joint report.

169 The report and motion required to be submitted by this proviso must be filed in
170 the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the council, who
171 shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers and to the
172 committee coordinator for the physical environment committee, or its successor.

173 SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists

174 and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or
175 safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.






