18	4	5. The department of transportation cor	nsiders the subject portion of the
19	1	right-of-way ("ROW") useless as part or	f the county road system and

20	believes the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the
21	public tax rolls.
22	6. The ROW is classified as "B-Class" and, in accordance with K.C.C.
23	14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on seventy-five
24	percent of the assessed value of the subject ROW, which was determined
25	from records of the department of assessments. King County is in receipt
26	of \$5,247.65 from the petitioner.
27	Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was
28	held by the office of the hearing examiner on the 6th day of October 2010.
29	In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation the
30	council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King
31	County to grant said petition.
32	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
33	SECTION 1. The council, on the effective date of this ordinance, hereby vacates
34	and abandons that portion of the Geo Bayne Road right-of-way, also known as County
35	Road No. 1224, as conveyed to King County by the recording of the Quit-Claim Deed
36	recorded in Volume 1204 of Deeds, on Page 279, records of King County, Washington as
37	described below:
38	That portion of the NE quarter of the NW quarter of Section 10, Township
39	21 North, Range 7 East, Willamette Meridian, King County, Washington,
40	described as follows:
41	All that portion of the Geo Bayne Road right-of-way, also
42	known as County Road No. 1224, located in said

43	subdivision and deeded to King County by the Quit-Claim
44	Deed recorded in Volume 1204 of Deeds, on Page 279,
45	records of King County Washington, lying northerly of the
46	Cumberland Kanaskat Road SE right-of-way.

DEPARTMENT'S REPORT:

The Department of Transportation's written report to the Hearing Examiner for road vacation petition V-2647 was received by the Examiner on September 9, 2010.

PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the Department's report and accompanying attachments and exhibits, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the petition and report as follows:

The hearing was opened by the Examiner on October 6, 2010, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Seattle, Washington 98104. The hearing was then continued administratively for receipt of the Affidavit of Publication, which was received October 15, 2010. Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the Hearing Examiner.

FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION: Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS:

1. General Information:

- 2. Notice of hearing on the Department's report was given as required by law, and a hearing on the report was conducted by the Examiner on behalf of the Metropolitan King County Council.
- 3. Except as provided herein, the Examiner adopts and incorporates herein by this reference the facts set forth in the Department's report and the statements of fact contained in Proposed Ordinance No. 2010-0458. The Department's report will be attached to those copies of this report and recommendation that are submitted to the County Council.
- 4. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated are in the hearing record as exhibit nos. 6 and 10.
- 5. The subject right-of-way segment is not currently opened or maintained for public use.
- 6. Vacation of the right-of-way would have no adverse effect on the provision of access and fire and emergency services to the abutting properties and surrounding area.
- 7. The right-of-way is not necessary for the present or future public road system for travel or utilities purposes.
- 8. A utility easement to Puget Sound Energy has been recorded for existing utility facilities. No other easements are necessary to be retained for construction, repair and maintenance of public utilities and services.
- 9. The compensation required by law to be paid as a condition precedent to vacation of this road has been deposited with King County.

1. The right-of-way segment subject to this petition is not useful as part of the King County road system, and the public will be benefited by its vacation.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before November 8, 2010. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and two copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before November 15, 2010.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1039, King County Courthouse, 516 Third Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council Final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within 21 days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.
