PRELIMINARY REPORT:

The DNRP Report on item no. E10CT052 was received by the Examiner on February 25, 2011. A revised Report was submitted on March 16, 2011.

PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the report and examining available information on file with the application, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the application on March 16, 2011, in the King County Courthouse, 12th floor, room W-1201, Seattle, Washington.

¹ The Report and Recommendation, originally issued March 28, 2011, is revised in response to amendments to the PBRs program enacted by Ordinance 17052, effective April 9, 2011.

Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the Hearing Examiner.

FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION: Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS:

1. **General Information:**

Owner: Matthew and Nancy Sanborn

Location: South and west of and adjacent to 11327 Upper Preston Road SE, Issaquah

PBRS categories requested and staff-proposed:

(The land area recommended for PBRS enrollment is the entire parcel less the excluded area, which is what has been calculated by DNRP. In the event the County Assessor's official parcel size is revised, the PBRS acreage shall be administratively adjusted to reflect that change.)

2. Timely application was made to King County for PBRS current use valuation of the property to begin in 2012. Notice of the application was given as required by law.
3. Except as modified herein, the facts set forth in the Revised DNRP Preliminary Report and testimony in the March 16, 2011, public hearing are found correct and are incorporated herein by reference. Copies of the department report will be provided with the copies of this report submitted to the Metropolitan King County Council.

4. Effective April 9, 2011, the requirements for qualification under the watershed protection area category were amended by Ordinance no. 17052. DNRP originally recommended award under the prior code version. Subsequent to the amendment, DNRP has confirmed that the property is still eligible for award under the watershed protection area category. (Exhibit No. 16)
5. Award of credit under the buffer to public land category is contingent on enrollment of the parcel to the north in the PBRS program, anticipated for the 2012 tax year. Failure of the adjacent parcel to enroll would preclude this property from receiving credit for the category, reduce the total point award by 3 points and may result in a less reduced valuation for the enrolled portion of the property.
6. Subject to the above-noted contingency, the property contains priority open space resources and is eligible for a total award of 13 points under the King County Public Benefit Rating System. The resulting current use valuation therefore would be 40% of market value for 4.38 acres of the property.
7. Additional credit may be awarded administratively under the forest stewardship land category *subject to submittal of a forest stewardship plan by July 1, 2011, and subsequent County approval by September 1, 2011*. Award of credit under this category would increase the point total by 5 points, resulting in a current use valuation as low as 30% for the enrolled portion of the property.

CONCLUSION:

1. Subject to the above-noted contingency, approval of current use valuation of 40% of market value (as low as 30% conditionally) for 4.38 acres of the property pursuant to the Public Benefit Rating System adopted by Chapter 20.36 KCC would be consistent with the purposes and intent of King County to maintain, preserve, conserve and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space lands and to assure the use and enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being of King County and its citizens.


RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE current use valuation of 40% of market value (as low as 30% conditionally) for 4.38 acres of the property, subject to the conditions recommended in the DNRP report, the above-noted contingency and the following conditional allowance:

- A. Credit may be awarded administratively under the forest stewardship land category as stated in Finding no. 7 above. Award of credit under this category would increase the point total by 5 points, resulting in a current use valuation as low as 30% for the enrolled portion of the property.

Current use valuation shall be subject to all terms and conditions of RCW Chapter 84.34 and KCC Chapter 20.36, as may be amended from time to time, and all regulations and rules duly adopted to implement state law and county ordinances pertaining to current use valuation.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL
AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED**

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) *on or before April 29, 2011*. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and two copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council *on or before May 6, 2011*. Appeal statements may refer only to facts contained in the hearing record; new facts may not be presented on appeal.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1200, King County Courthouse, 516 Third Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council is final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within 21 days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.

OPEN SPACE TAXATION AGREEMENT

Chapter 84.34 RCW

(To be used for "Open Space", "Timber Land" Classification or "Reclassification" Only)

 This agreement is between **XX** hereinafter called the "Owner", and
King County, Washington hereinafter called the "Granting Authority".

Whereas, the owner of the above described real property having made application for classification of that property under the provisions of Chapter 84.34 RCW. And whereas, both the owner and granting authority agree to limit the use of said property, recognizing that such land has substantial public value as open space and that the preservation of such land constitutes an important physical, social, esthetic, and economic asset to the public, and both parties agree that the classification of the property during the life of this agreement shall be for:

Open Space Land

Now, therefore, the parties, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, do agree as follows:

1. During the term of this agreement, the land shall be used only in accordance with the preservation of its classified use.
2. No structures shall be erected upon such land except those directly related to, and compatible with, the classified use of the land.
3. This agreement shall be effective commencing on the date the legislative body receives the signed agreement from the property owner and shall remain in effect until the property is withdrawn or removed from classification.
4. This agreement shall apply to the parcels of land described herein and shall be binding upon the heirs, successors and assignees of the parties hereto.
5. The landowner may withdraw from this agreement if, after a period of eight years, he or she files a request to **withdraw** classification with the assessor. Two years from the date of that request the assessor shall withdraw classification from the land, and the applicable taxes and interest shall be imposed as provided in RCW 84.34.070 and 84.34.108.
6. After the effective date of this agreement, any change in use of the land, except through compliance with items (5), (7), or (9), shall be considered a **breach** of this agreement, and shall be subject to removal of classification and liable for applicable taxes, penalties, and interest as provided in RCW 84.34.080 and RCW 84.34.108.
7. A **breach** of agreement shall not have occurred and the additional tax shall not be imposed if removal of classification resulted solely from:
 - a) Transfer to a governmental entity in exchange for other land located within the State of Washington;
 - b) A taking through the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or sale or transfer to an entity having the power in anticipation of the exercise of such power and having manifested its intent in writing or by other official action;
 - c) A natural disaster such as a flood, windstorm, earthquake, or other such calamity rather than by virtue of the act of the land owner changing the use of such property;
 - d) Official action by an agency of the State of Washington or by the county or city where the land is located disallowing the present use of such land
 - e) Transfer of land to a church when such land would qualify for exemption pursuant to RCW 84.36.020;
 - f) Acquisition of property interests by State agencies or agencies or organizations qualified under RCW 84.34.210 and 64.04.130 (see RCW 84.34.108(6)(f));

- g) Removal of land classified as farm and agricultural land under RCW 84.34.020(2)(e);
 - h) Removal of land from classification after enactment of a statutory exemption that qualifies the land for exemption and receipt of notice from the owner to remove the land from classification;
 - i) The creation, sale, or transfer of forestry riparian easements under RCW 76.13.120;
 - j) The creation, sale, or transfer of a fee interest or a conservation easement of private forest lands within unconfined channel migration zones or containing critical habitat for threatened or endangered species under RCW 76.09.040;
 - k) The sale or transfer of land within two years after the death of the owner of at least a fifty percent interest in the land if the land has been assessed and valued as forest land under chapter 84.33 RCW, or under chapter 84.34 RCW continuously since 1993. The date of death shown on the death certificate is the date used; or
 - l) The discovery that the land was classified in error through no fault of the owner.
8. The county assessor may require an owner to submit data relevant to continuing the eligibility of any parcel of land described in this agreement.
 9. The owner may apply for reclassification as provided in Chapter 84.34 RCW.
 10. This agreement shall supersede any previous current use taxation agreement entered into for the subject property.

This agreement shall be subject to the following conditions:

It is declared that this agreement specifies the classification and conditions as provided for in Chapter 84.34 RCW and the conditions imposed by this Granting Authority. This agreement to tax according to the use of the property is not a contract and can be annulled or canceled at any time by the Legislature (RCW 84.34.070).
