1 AN ORDINANCE making corrections and updating county
2 code sections relating to county funds; amending
3 Ordinance 15961, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C.
4 4A.200.170, Ordinance 13263, Section 33, as amended,
5 and K.C.C. 4A.200.200, Ordinance 17527, Section 162, as
6 amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.640, Ordinance 9368,
7 Sections 1 and 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.360,
8 Ordinance 17527, Section 150, and K.C.C. 4A200.220 and
9 Ordinance 12925, Sections 1 through 7, as amended, and
10 K.C.C. 4A.200.760, adding new sections to K.C.C. chapter
11 4A.200 and recodifying K.C.C. 4A.200.220 and K.C.C.
12 4A.200.640.

13 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

14 NEW SECTION. SECTION 1. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200
15 a new section to read as follows:

16 A. There is hereby created the automated fingerprint identification system fund.

17 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

18 C. The regional director of the automated fingerprint identification system
19 agency shall be the manager of the fund.

20 D. The fund shall account for the proceeds of the property tax levy approved by
21 the voters of King County on November 6, 2012, in excess of the levy limitation
22 contained in chapter 84.55 RCW. The six-year levy commencing in 2013 has been
23 approved by the voters for the express purpose of paying costs associated with the
24 provision of regional automated fingerprint identification services for King County's law
25 enforcement agencies.

26 E. Levy moneys in the fund shall be used in accordance with those described in
27 Ordinance 17381, Section 5. Eligible expenditures from the fund include the necessary
28 software and hardware operations and maintenance expenses, salaries, benefits, training,
29 office and laboratory supplies and equipment, work space, contracted goods and services,
30 related studies and research, administration and other costs incidental to the operation and
31 enhancement of the regional program.

32 F. The fund shall be considered a fund through the life of the levy approved in
33 2012 and any successive levies, unless otherwise required by ordinance.

34 SECTION 2. Ordinance 15961, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.170
35 are hereby amended to read as follows:

36 A. There is hereby created the children and families services fund.

37 B. The fund shall be a (~~second~~) first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

38 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
39 manager of the fund.

40 D. The fund shall be used to collect revenue from state, local and other funding
41 sources and to expend direct service and related administration dollars to support a broad
42 array of human services for children and families to help them achieve self-sufficiency.

43 SECTION 3. Ordinance 13263, Section 33, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.200
44 are hereby amended to read as follows:

45 A. There is hereby created the code compliance and abatement fund.

46 B. The fund is a first tier fund as described in this chapter. It is a special revenue
47 fund.

48 C. The director of the department of permitting and environmental review ~~((is))~~
49 shall be the manager of the fund.

50 D. All moneys collected from the assessment of civil penalties, from cleanup
51 restitution payments to the agency, from the recovery of the costs of pursuing code
52 compliance and abatement and from the recovery of abatement costs ~~((except those~~
53 ~~moneys designated for the critical areas mitigation fund in section 150 of this~~
54 ~~ordinance,))~~ shall be deposited in the fund.

55 E. The fund shall support abatement and code enforcement administrative costs,
56 including, but not limited to, personnel costs, and shall be accounted for through either
57 creation of a fund or other appropriate accounting mechanism in the department issuing
58 the citation or notice and order under which the abatement occurred.

59 F. Withdrawals from the moneys collected under this section for the purpose of
60 funding administrative costs within the code enforcement section of the department of
61 permitting and environmental review shall not exceed one hundred seventy-five thousand
62 dollars in a calendar year.

63 NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200
64 a new section to read as follows:

65 A. There is hereby created the department of permitting and environmental
66 review fund.

67 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

68 C. The director of the department of permitting and environmental review shall
69 be the manager of the fund.

70 D. All receipts from federal, state and local sources, including license and permit
71 fees administered by the department of permitting and environmental review, shall be
72 deposited in the fund.

73 E. The fund shall be used to support permitting and environmental review
74 activities and related administration.

75 NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200
76 a new section to read as follows:

77 A. There is hereby created the developmental disabilities fund.

78 B. The fund shall be a second tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

79 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
80 manager of the fund.

81 D. The fund shall be used to collect revenue from federal, state and other funding
82 sources and to expend funds for developmental disabilities services and related
83 administration.

84 NEW SECTION. SECTION 6. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200
85 a new section to read as follows:

86 A. There is hereby created the emergency medical services fund.

87 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

88 C. The director of the department of public health shall be the manager of the
89 fund.

90 D. All receipts in the fund shall be used for the purpose of accounting for the
91 proceeds of the property tax levy approved by the voters of King County on November 5,
92 2013, in excess of the levy limitation contained in chapter 84.55 RCW. The six-year
93 levy, commencing in 2014, was approved by the voters for the express purpose of paying
94 costs associated with the provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical
95 services, as authorized by 84.52.069 RCW.

96 E. The fund shall be considered a fund through the life of the levy approved in
97 2013 and any successive levies, unless otherwise required by ordinance.

98 NEW SECTION. SECTION 7. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200
99 a new section to read as follows:

100 A. There is hereby created the employment and education resources fund.

101 B. The fund shall be a second tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

102 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
103 manager of the fund.

104 D. The fund shall be used to collect revenue from federal, state and other funding
105 sources and to expend direct service and related administration dollars to support
106 comprehensive employment and training services for adults and youth to help them
107 achieve self-sufficiency.

108 NEW SECTION. SECTION 8. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200
109 a new section to read as follows:

110 A. There is hereby created the environmental resource fund.

111 B. The fund is a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.

112 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
113 manager of the fund.

114 D. All moneys from the city of Tacoma as mitigation for its pipeline project shall
115 be deposited in the fund.

116 E. All moneys in the fund shall be used for the purpose of paying all or any part
117 of capital projects related to ecosystem restoration projects in the Green River basin.

118 SECTION 9. K.C.C. 4A.200.640, as amended by this ordinance, is hereby
119 recodified as a new section in K.C.C. chapter 4A.200 to follow K.C.C. 4A.200.280.

120 SECTION 10. Ordinance 17527, Section 162, as amended, and K.C.C.
121 4A.200.640 is hereby amended to read as follows:

122 A. There is hereby created a (~~roads and water and land~~) equipment rental and
123 revolving fund.

124 B. The fund is a first tier fund. The fund is an internal service fund.

125 C. The director of the department of transportation shall be the manager of the
126 fund.

127 D. All receipts from rates charged for full cost recovery for the fund's services to
128 county agencies shall be deposited in the fund.

129 NEW SECTION. SECTION 11. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
130 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

131 A. There is hereby created a farmlands and open space acquisition fund.

132 B. The fund is a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.

133 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
134 manager of the fund.

135 D. Moneys for purchase of agriculture development rights or improvements on
136 agriculture land owned by the county shall be deposited in the fund.

137 E. All moneys in the fund shall be used for the purpose of paying all or any part
138 of capital projects related to acquiring agricultural development rights or making
139 improvements on agriculture lands owned by the county.

140 NEW SECTION. SECTION 12. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
141 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

142 A. There is hereby created the federal housing and community development fund.

143 B. The fund shall be a second tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

144 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
145 manager of the fund.

146 D. The fund shall be used to collect revenue from federal, state and other funding
147 sources and to expend direct costs and related administration to support non-county
148 organizations that acquire, renovate or construct housing for very low to moderate-
149 income individuals and families, including homeless households and households with
150 special housing needs by securing a property interest in each project. The fund may also
151 support housing operating costs, rental assistance and services for low-income
152 individuals and families, including homeless households and households with special
153 housing needs.

154 NEW SECTION. SECTION 13. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
155 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

156 A. There is hereby created the financial management services fund.

157 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is an internal services fund.

158 C. The director of the department of executive services shall be the manager of
159 the fund.

160 D. All receipts from rates charged for the fund's services to county agencies shall
161 be deposited in the fund.

162 SECTION 14. Ordinance 9368, Sections 1 and 2, as amended, and K.C.C.

163 4A.200.360 are hereby amended to read as follows:

164 A. There is hereby created the housing opportunity (~~(acquisition)~~) fund.

165 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

166 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
167 manager of the fund.

168 D. The fund shall support noncounty organizations that acquire, renovate or
169 construct housing for very low to moderate-income individuals and families, including
170 homeless households and households with special housing needs by securing a property
171 interest in each project. The fund may also support housing operating costs, rental
172 assistance and services for low-income individuals and families, including homeless
173 households and households with special housing needs.

174 NEW SECTION. SECTION 15. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter

175 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

176 A. There is hereby created the information technology strategy and performance
177 operating fund.

178 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is an internal service fund.

179 C. The director of the department of information technology shall be the fund
180 manager.

181 D. The purpose of the information technology strategy and performance
182 operating fund is to account for the assets, liabilities, revenues and expenditures
183 pertaining to the information technology strategy and performance operations including
184 the chief information officer, the strategic planning office, performance evaluation,
185 information technology governance and information technology security and privacy.

186 E. All receipts from rates charged for the fund's services to county agencies shall
187 be deposited in the fund.

188 NEW SECTION. SECTION 16. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
189 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

190 A. There is hereby created the intercounty river improvement fund.

191 B. The fund is a second tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

192 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
193 manager of the fund.

194 D. All moneys from the intercounty river improvement levy shall be deposited in
195 the fund.

196 E. All moneys in the fund shall be used for the purpose of paying all or any part
197 of the cost and expense of providing flood control in the White River basin.

198 NEW SECTION. SECTION 17. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
199 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

200 A. There is hereby created the limited general obligation bond redemption fund.

201 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a debt service fund.

202 C. The director of the finance and business operations division shall be the fund
203 manager.

204 D. The fund is used to account for the accumulation of resources that are
205 restricted, committed or assigned for, and the payment of long-term and short-term debt
206 principal and interest.

207 NEW SECTION. SECTION 18. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
208 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

209 A. There is hereby created the mental health fund.

210 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

211 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
212 manager of the fund.

213 D. The fund shall be used to collect revenue from federal, state and other funding
214 sources and to expend funds for mental health treatment and services and related
215 administration.

216 SECTION 19. K.C.C. 4A.200.220, as amended by this ordinance, is hereby
217 recodified as a new section in K.C.C. chapter 4A.200 to follow K.C.C. 4A.200.450.

218 SECTION 20. Ordinance 17527, Section 150, and K.C.C. 4A.200.220 are hereby
219 amended to read as follows:

220 A. There is hereby created a (~~critical areas~~) natural resources mitigation fund.

221 B. The fund is a first tier fund. The fund is a special revenue fund.

222 C. The director of the department of (~~permitting and environmental review~~)
223 natural resources and parks shall be the manager of the fund.

224 D. ~~((All moneys))~~ Moneys received from ~~((penalties resulting from the violation~~
225 ~~of rules and laws regulating development activities within critical areas))~~ the following
226 sources shall be deposited in the fund:

227 1. Moneys received as mitigation payments through King County's in-lieu fee
228 mitigation program;

229 2. Moneys received as a result of a directive from local, state or federal
230 regulatory agencies or resource management entities for the purpose of implementing
231 programs, activities or projects that will enhance or improve the environment to offset
232 environmental impacts as directed by the local, state or federal regulatory agencies or
233 resource management entities.

234 E. Moneys received from the~~((fund shall only be used for paying the cost of~~
235 ~~enforcing and implementing critical area laws and rules))~~ entry of consent decrees, court
236 orders, court-approved settlement agreements and decisions or orders arising out of
237 administrative proceedings may be contributed to the fund.

238 F. Moneys in the fund are to be held and disbursed as follows:

239 1. Moneys collected as mitigation payments through King County's in-lieu fee
240 program shall be used for programs, activities or projects in King County's in-lieu fee
241 program;

242 2. Moneys received from sources other than mitigation payments through King
243 County's in-lieu fee program may be used for:

244 a. programs, activities or projects in King County's in-lieu fee program; and

245 b. programs, activities or projects that will enhance or improve the
246 environment to offset impacts to the environment in accordance with the terms of any
247 directive to pay the moneys into the fund; and

248 3. Moneys received from the entry of consent decrees, court orders, court-
249 approved settlement agreements and decisions or orders arising out of administrative
250 proceedings shall be used in a manner consistent with the terms of the originating source.

251 G. Moneys in the fund not needed for immediate expenditure shall be deposited
252 into an investment fund in accordance with RCW 36.29.020.

253 NEW SECTION. SECTION 21. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
254 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

255 A. There is hereby created the open space acquisition fund.

256 B. The fund is a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.

257 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
258 manager of the fund.

259 D. All moneys for open space acquisitions or easements shall be deposited in the
260 fund.

261 E. All moneys in the fund shall be used for the purpose of paying all or any part
262 of capital projects related to acquiring open space or open space easements.

263 NEW SECTION. SECTION 22. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
264 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

265 A. There is hereby created the surface water management construction fund.

266 B. The fund is a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.

267 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
268 manager of the fund.

269 D. All moneys for construction of surface water capital projects shall be
270 deposited in the fund.

271 E. All moneys in the fund shall be used for the purpose of paying all or any part
272 of capital facilities related to surface and stormwater management.

273 NEW SECTION. SECTION 23. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
274 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

275 A. There is hereby created the unlimited general obligation bond redemption
276 fund.

277 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a debt service fund.

278 C. The director of the finance and business operations division shall be the fund
279 manager.

280 D. The fund is used to account for the accumulation of resources that are
281 restricted, committed or assigned for, and the payment of long-term and short-term debt
282 principal and interest, as approved by qualified electors of King County at a special
283 election.

284 NEW SECTION. SECTION 24. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
285 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

286 A. There is hereby created the urban reforestation and habitat restoration fund.

287 B. The fund is a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.

288 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
289 manager of the fund.

290 D. All moneys for funding reforestation and habitat restoration projects shall be
291 deposited in the fund.

292 E. All moneys in the fund can only be expended for urban reforestation and
293 habitat restoration projects.

294 NEW SECTION. SECTION 25. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
295 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

296 A. There is hereby created the veterans services fund.

297 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

298 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
299 manager of the fund.

300 D. The fund shall be used to collect revenue generated from a portion of the local
301 property taxes levied under RCW 73.08.080 that is separate from the veterans and human
302 services levy, and to expend direct costs and related administration to provide an array of
303 services to assist veterans and their families on their path toward self-sufficiency.

304 NEW SECTION. SECTION 26. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter
305 4A.200 a new section to read as follows:

306 A. There is hereby created the working forest fund.

307 B. The fund is a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.

308 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
309 manager of the fund.

310 D. All moneys for preservation of working forests shall be deposited in the fund.

311 E. All moneys in the fund shall be used for the purpose of paying all or any part
312 of capital projects related to preserving working forests.

313 SECTION 27. Ordinance 12925, Sections 1 through 7, as amended, and K.C.C.
314 4A.200.760 are hereby amended to read as follows:

315 A. There is hereby created the wastewater equipment rental and revolving fund.

316 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is an internal service fund.

317 C. The director of the department of transportation shall be the manager of the
318 fund.

319 ~~(C.)~~ D. All receipts from rates charged for the fund's services to the wastewater
320 treatment division shall be deposited in the fund.

321 ~~(D.)~~ E. The fund shall account for financial resources for the full cost recovery
322 of rolling stock purchased by the water quality fund. The department of transportation
323 shall establish charges for full cost recovery for the equipment accounted for by the fund
324 and shall establish the terms and charges for sale of surplus equipment.

325 ~~(E. Annual appropriations of sewer rate revenues shall be included in the~~
326 ~~wastewater treatment operating budget for transfer to the wastewater equipment, rental~~
327 ~~and revolving fund. The annual appropriation shall be based upon the charges for full~~
328 ~~cost recovery as determined by the department of transportation to be sufficient for full~~
329 ~~cost recovery. Transfers from the water quality fund to the wastewater equipment, rental~~
330 ~~and revolving fund shall be made periodically, consistent with RCW 36.33A.050, and~~
331 ~~shall be credited as revenues to the wastewater equipment, rental and revolving fund.~~

332 ~~F. Revenue from the sale of surplus equipment originally purchased with moneys~~
333 ~~from the water quality fund, and transferred to the wastewater equipment, rental and~~
334 ~~revolving fund, shall be deposited and credited to the wastewater equipment, rental and~~
335 ~~revolving fund. The revenues shall be included in the calculation of the rental rates by~~

336 the department of transportation. Annual appropriations of sewer rate revenues shall be
337 included in the wastewater treatment operating budget for transfer to the wastewater
338 equipment, rental and revolving fund. The annual appropriation shall be based upon the
339 charges for full cost recovery as determined by the department of transportation to be
340 sufficient for full cost recovery.

341 G. ~~The fund may only be used for full cost recovery associated with management~~
342 ~~of the fleet.))~~
