1 AN ORDINANCE authorizing the King County executive
2 to execute an amendment to the interlocal agreement with
3 the King County flood control zone district extending the
4 duration of the interlocal agreement up to December 31,
5 2020; and declaring an emergency.

6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

7 SECTION 1. Findings:

8 A. King County and the King County flood control zone district entered into the
9 Interlocal Agreement Between King County and the King County Flood Control Zone
10 District Regarding Flood Protection Services, effective January 1, 2016.

11 B. The county adopted Ordinance 18854 to extend the term of the interlocal
12 agreement with the district from December 31, 2018, to December 31, 2019.

13 C. The county adopted Ordinance 19046 to authorizing the extension of the term
14 of the interlocal agreement with the district for a period not to extend beyond from
15 December 31, 2020.

16 D. The county and the district executed and amendment to the interlocal
17 agreement extending its term to March 31, 2020, in order to give the parties time to
18 negotiate a new interlocal agreement.

19 E. While the parties have made progress on a number of substantive terms to be

20 included the new interlocal agreement, negotiations are ongoing.

21 F. The county and the district desire to continue to operate under the terms of the
22 interlocal agreement until the terms of the new interlocal agreement are finalized and it is
23 executed by the parties. To that end, and to preserve the status quo, at its March 4, 2020,
24 meeting, the flood district executive committee recommended to the district's supervisors
25 to extend the term of the current 2016 interlocal agreement up to December 31, 2020.

26 G. The third amendment to the interlocal agreement, Attachment A to this
27 ordinance, amends the interlocal agreement to extend the term of mutually agreeable
28 date certain but not to not exceed December 31, 2020.

29 H. Extending the current interlocal agreement is necessary for the immediate
30 preservation of the parties' ability to continue, unabated, to provide flood management
31 and protection services, which will preserve the health and safety of the residents of King
32 County and help protect them from the ravages of flooding.

33 SECTION 2. The council supports and authorizes the executive to execute a third
34 amendment, substantially in the form of Attachment A to this ordinance, to the current
35 interlocal agreement entitled Interlocal Agreement Between King County and the King
36 County Flood Control Zone District Regarding Flood Protection Services. All other
37 provisions of the interlocal agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

38 SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency
39 exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,

40 health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public
41 institutions.

**THIRD AMENDMENT TO
INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN
KING COUNTY AND THE KING COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT
REGARDING FLOOD PROTECTION SERVICES**

THIS THIRD AMENDMENT to the “Interlocal Agreement between King County and the King County Flood Control Zone District Regarding Flood Protection Services” (“Agreement”), is entered into by KING COUNTY, a home rule charter County in the State of Washington (“County”) and KING COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT, a quasi-municipal corporation of the State of Washington (“District”), and shall be effective upon execution by both Parties.

The Parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- 1. The text of Section 13.1 is deleted and replaced with the following:

This Agreement shall take effect January 1, 2016 and shall remain in effect through _____.

All other terms of the Agreement not amended by this Third Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
