1 AN ORDINANCE approving the grant funding allocation
 2 for projects funded through the 2020-2025 parks,
 3 recreation, trails, and open space levy grant program in
 4 accordance with Ordinance 18890, Motion 15378,
 5 Ordinance 19166, and the 2023-2024 Biennial Budget
 6 Ordinance, Ordinance 19546, Section 95.

7 **STATEMENT OF FACTS:**

8 1. Ordinance 18890, which took effect May 13, 2019, called for a special
 9 election to authorize the King County parks, recreation, trails and open
 10 space levy. On August 6, 2019, King County voters approved the levy,
 11 which included funding for various grant programs including parks capital
 12 and open space, and aquatics facilities.

13 2. Ordinance 19166, established grant award criteria and the process for
 14 the King County parks, recreation, trails and open space levy grant
 15 programs, as well as the proposed composition of advisory committees in
 16 accordance with Ordinance 18890, Section 6, Motion 15378, Section F.1.,
 17 and Attachments A, B, D, and E to Motion 15378.

18 3. The parks capital and open space grant program under Attachment A to
 19 Ordinance 19166 will provide funding for a range of land improvements,
 20 including land acquisition, park and open space development, habitat

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21 conservation, community gardens and construction of passive and active
22 recreation facilities. The goal of the program is to acquire lands that might
23 be lost to future development pressures, and also to construct new and
24 improved facilities to address rapid growth in urban areas.

25 4. The targeted equity grant program under Attachment B to Ordinance
26 19166 will provide levy proceeds for a range of projects, including
27 capacity building, such as community outreach and planning; land
28 acquisition in opportunity areas or areas that serve a community of need;
29 capital projects or programs in underserved areas; and projects providing
30 access to parks, open spaces, or recreation opportunities for people with
31 disabilities. The goal of the program is to increase access and use of
32 parks, open spaces, recreational facilities, and related programming in
33 underserved areas.

34 5. The aquatic facilities grant program under Attachment C to Ordinance
35 19166 will provide levy proceeds for a wide range of improvements to
36 public aquatics facilities located in King County. The projects may
37 include feasibility studies, design, permitting and new construction or
38 improvements to existing capital facilities. The grant program will assist
39 communities as the region grows and existing facilities become obsolete
40 or reach capacity.

41 6. The open space river corridors grant program under Attachment D to
42 Ordinance 19166 will provide levy proceeds for flood risk reduction,
43 habitat restoration, open space, and recreation in river corridors. The goal

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44 of the program is to incentivize projects that integrate multiple attributes
45 of projects inside river corridors such as flood control, habitat, passive
46 recreation, and trails.

47 7. The parks capital and open space/aquatic facilities advisory committee,
48 targeted equity grant advisory committee, and open space-river corridors
49 advisory committee each convened in the spring of 2023 to review and
50 score grant applications and have recommended funding for the projects
51 listed in sections 1 through 4 of this ordinance, based upon the eligibility
52 and additional criteria set forth in Attachments A, B, C, and D to
53 Ordinance 19166.

54 8. The award recommendations are the second of three biennial processes
55 for parks capital and open space grant, aquatic facilities grant, and open
56 space river corridor grant. The final grant award process is expected in
57 2025.

58 9. The targeted equity grant award recommendations are the second of
59 four annual grant award processes in this levy. The next targeted equity
60 grant award processes are expected in 2024 and 2025.

61 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

62 SECTION 1. The King County council authorizes the funding of parks capital
63 and open space grant projects for 2023, totaling \$9,990,235, as follows:

93 SECTION 2. The King County council authorizes the funding of targeted equity
94 grant projects for 2023, totaling \$1,294,965, as follows:

95 A. After-School All-Stars Puget Sound: \$199,398 for "ASAS Recreation &
96 Wellness for Underserved Youth";

97 B. Bike Works Seattle: \$187,500 for "Bicycle Access & Education Programs";

98 C. Concord International Elementary PTA – Seattle Parks Foundation: \$182,932
99 for "Puma Playfield at Concord International School";

100 D. Golden Bricks Events – Young Women Empowered: \$187,500 for "Refuge
101 Outdoor Festival and Sundaes Outside";

102 E. Para Los Niños de Highline: \$50,000 for "Para Los Niños sports & Activities
103 Scholarships";

104 F. Rainier Prep: \$65,500 for "Rainier Prep Physical Education and Recreation";

105 G. Somali Cultural Center – Somali Health Board: \$115,708 for "Hoops for
106 Hope";

107 H. The Nature Project: \$47,932 for "Let's Get Outside with The Nature Project";

108 I. Whitewater Aquatics Management: \$103,495 for "Evergreen Pool Learn and
109 Swim Project"; and

110 J. Young Women Empowered (Y-WE): \$155,000 for "Y-WE Nature
111 Connections."

117 C. City of Renton: \$904,440 for "Henry Moses Aquatic Center Updates";

118 D. City of Sammamish: \$223,165 for "Sammamish Tile Replacement";

119 E. City of Snoqualmie: \$1,000,000 for "Snoqualmie Community Center
120 Expansion";

121 F. Highline Public Schools: \$100,000 for "Evergreen Pool Windows
122 Replacement";

123 G. Lake Washington School District: \$2,000,000 for "Juanita Aquatics
124 Renovation Phase 2";

127 corridor grant projects for 2023, totaling \$8,940,104, as follows:

129 B. City of Tukwila: \$280,000 for "Chinook Wind Extension";

130 C. City of Woodinville: \$250,000 for "Wilmot Gateway Park Boat Launch
131 Ramp";

132 D. EarthCorps: \$679,977 for "Duwamish River Restoration in Tukwila";

133 E. King County Parks and Recreation: \$410,000 for "Kanaskat Natural Area In-
134 Holding Acquisition";

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135 F. King County Parks and Recreation: \$132,075 for "Auburn Narrows Natural
136 Area Expansion";

137 G. King County Parks and Recreation: \$894,900 for "Middle Fork Snoqualmie


Ordinance 19666 was introduced on 7/18/2023 and passed by the Metropolitan King County Council on 9/5/2023, by the following vote:

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
