1 AN ORDINANCE making a net supplemental
 2 appropriation of \$25,114,000 to various general fund
 3 agencies, a net supplemental appropriation of \$101,179,000
 4 to various non-general fund agencies and a net
 5 supplemental appropriation of \$1,944,800 from various
 6 capital fund budgets; and amending the 2023-2024 Biennial
 7 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 19546, Sections 21, 21, 23,
 8 40, 42, 42, 46, 47, 49, 61, 65, 72, 72, 83, 83, 91, 91, 107,
 9 120, and 129, as amended, and Attachment A, as amended.

10 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

11 SECTION 1. Ordinance 19546, Section 21, as amended is hereby amended as
 12 follows:

13 SHERIFF – From the general fund there is hereby disappropriated from:
 14 Sheriff (\$700,000)

15 SECTION 2. The council directs that section 1 of this ordinance take effect
 16 before section 3 of this ordinance.

17 SECTION 3. Ordinance 19546, Section 21, as amended, is hereby amended as
 18 follows:

19 SHERIFF - From the general fund there is hereby appropriated to:
 20 Sheriff \$700,000

21 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

22 Of this appropriation, \$300,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
23 support a crisis response program manager FTE position within the department of public
24 safety.

25 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

26 Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
27 support a voluntary safe firearm and ammunition return program in 2023.

28 ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

29 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support
30 the city of Maple Valley with moneys for coordination of traffic control with other
31 jurisdictions in the unincorporated areas around Lake Wilderness park for the national
32 IRONMAN triathlon to take place on September 17, 2023.

33 ER4 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

34 Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
35 webpage for the sheriff's office includes a prominent, public-facing section dedicated to
36 voluntary firearm surrender and/or return information including all options available to
37 the public to 4 relinquish unwanted firearms and ammunition to the sheriff's office. The
38 webpage 5 section should be active and publicly accessible by July 1, 2024.

39 ER6 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

40 Of this appropriation, \$126,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
41 support at least two voluntary safe firearm and ammunition return events in 2024.

42 ER7 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

Ordinance 19879

43 Of this appropriation, \$75,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support
44 additional overtime hours for traffic patrols in Precinct 3, particularly in the Fairwood
45 area of unincorporated King County.

46 ER8 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

47 Of this appropriation \$100,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for the
48 sheriff's office to conduct DNA testing for unidentified remains, cold cases, and other
49 evidence, and for those remains, cold cases, and other evidence that failed to yield a
50 Combined DNA Index System match, for forensic genetic genealogy DNA testing to be
51 conducted. King County may contract for these services. For the purposes of this
52 expenditure restriction, "forensic genetic genealogy DNA testing" means any technology
53 performed in a forensic laboratory capable of producing a forensic genealogy profile with a
54 minimum of 100,000 genetic markers and compatible with multiple genealogical databases
55 consented for law enforcement use. Records from the NDA testing or forensic genetic
56 genealogy DNA testing, including DNA profiles and markers, of unidentified remains
57 should be used solely for the purpose of establishing identification.

58 P1 PROVIDED THAT:

59 Of this appropriation, \$700,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
60 executive transmits a crisis response program report (~~and a motion that should~~
61 ~~acknowledge receipt of the report, and a motion acknowledging receipt of the report is~~
62 ~~passed by the council. The motion should reference the subject matter, the proviso's~~
63 ~~ordinance number, ordinance section and proviso number in both the title and body of the~~
64 ~~motion~~)).

65 The plan shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

66 A. A description of the executive's community engagement efforts in each
67 department of public safety precinct, including a list of local governments, community
68 organizations, nonprofits, neighborhood groups, renter associations, homeowner
69 associations, schools and businesses consulted in the development of the crisis response
70 program;

71 B. A summary of each department of public safety's precinct's preferred crisis
72 response program model, including general program structure and process for deploying
73 crisis response professionals;

74 C. A description of the policy or policies the department of public safety intends
75 to implement to guide the deployment of crisis response professionals in each department
76 of public safety precinct;

77 D. A description of the department of public safety's procedures for ensuring
78 interjurisdictional and interagency cooperation; and

79 E. A timeline for the crisis response program implementation in each department
80 of public safety precinct.

81 The executive should electronically file the report (~~and motion~~) required by this
82 proviso no later than December 31, 202~~((3))~~4, with the clerk of the council, who shall
83 retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief
84 of staff, and the lead staff for the law, justice, health and human services committee or its
85 successor.

102 before section 8 of this ordinance.

104 follows:

107 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

108 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall only be expended or encumbered to support
109 the King County Flood Control Zone District in retaining a consultant of the district's
110 choice to develop a vision plan for a multijurisdictional effort to rejuvenate the Green

111 river. The executive shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the King
112 County Flood Control Zone District that shall require that, as part of the development of
113 the vision plan, the consultant consult with appropriate county representatives designated
114 by the executive.

115 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

116 Of this appropriation, \$80,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
117 with the Greater Maple Valley Community Center for minor capital project support.

118 ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

119 Of this appropriation, moneys shall not be expended or encumbered for residential
120 outreach to publicize King County's programs and services.

121 ER4 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

122 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
123 support the King County Search and Rescue Association's headquarters site acquisition
124 and development capital project; and, of the moneys restricted by this Expenditure
125 Restriction ER4, up to \$100,000 shall be expended or encumbered to conduct a site study
126 for the capital project as described in Proviso P1 of this section.

127 ER5 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

128 Of this appropriation, \$21,928,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
129 support the following projects, contingent on the executive determining that each project
130 serves a fundamental governmental purpose, a county purpose for which the county is
131 receiving consideration, or support of the poor or infirm:

165 ER6 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

166 Of the moneys restricted by Expenditure Restriction ER5 of this section for South
 167 County Ball Fields, \$150,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support either
 168 improvements to existing fixed structures, including, but not limited to, concessions
 169 facilities, picnic areas, dugouts and bleachers, or construction of new fixed structures,
 170 including, but not limited to, concessions facilities, picnic areas, bleachers and shade
 171 structures, or both.

172 ER7 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

173 Of this appropriation, \$500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for a
 174 grant to Friends of Seattle Waterfront, dba Friends of Waterfront Seattle, to support the
 175 operation of a waterfront shuttle in downtown Seattle in 2023.

176 ER8 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

177 Of this appropriation, \$500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for a
 178 grant to Friends of Seattle Waterfront, dba Friends of Waterfront Seattle, to support the
 179 operation of a waterfront shuttle in downtown Seattle in 2024.

180 ER9 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

181 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for
182 preliminary planning and feasibility studies for a project by the African Business
183 Innovation Center.

184 ER10 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

185 Of this appropriation, \$52,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
186 with the Low Income Housing Institute to provide supportive services to the residents of
187 Camp Roberson or its successor, a tent shelter community currently located in council
188 district three, but may have a location outside of council district three.

189 ER11 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

190 Of this appropriation, \$400,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
191 contract with the Dispute Resolution Center for its Conflict Resolution for Everyone
192 (CoRE) basic mediation training program.

193 ER12 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

194 Of this appropriation, \$80,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
195 with Maple Valley Food Bank, Enumclaw Plateau Ministries, Covington Storehouse, and
196 Issaquah Food Bank to address food insecurity.

197 ER13 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

198 Of this appropriation, \$35,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
199 with Rainier Valley Corps to provide filing fee assistance for Deferred Action for
200 Childhood Arrivals recipients.

201 ER14 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

Ordinance 19879

202 Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
203 contract with Friends of Mukai.

204 ER15 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

205 Of this appropriation, \$30,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
206 with Maple Valley Farmers Market, Fairwood Market Night, and Enumclaw Farmers
207 Market for operational support.

208 ER16 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

209 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
210 with Maple Valley Creative Arts Council for arts programs for adults, children, and
211 youths.

212 ER17 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

213 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
214 with Ballard Northwest Senior Center for capital support.

215 ER 18 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

216 Of this appropriation, \$18,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
217 with the Snoqualmie Valley Food Bank to support its food pantry.

218 ER19 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

219 Of this appropriation, \$35,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
220 with University of Washington Women's Center for an anti-trafficking summit.

221 ER20 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

222 Of this appropriation, \$147,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
223 contract with the Catholic Community Services of Western Washington to provide
224 congregate meals for seniors.

225 ER21 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

226 Of this appropriation, \$200,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
227 contract with the King County Sexual Assault Resource Center to support provision of
228 services, education, and outreach.

229 ER 22 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

230 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
231 contract with Acres of Diamonds for capital support related to community-based
232 transitional housing for women and children.

233 ER23 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

234 Of this appropriation, \$600,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
235 contract with Lake City Partners to support a North King County senior women's shelter.

236 ER24 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

237 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
238 support the development and implementation of programs described in the gun violence
239 prevention plan required by Proviso P2 in this subsection.

240 ER25 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

241 Of this appropriation, (~~(\$200,000)~~) \$700,000 shall be expended or encumbered
242 solely to develop a labor-led dispatch and training center for hospitality, behavioral
243 health, janitorial, retail, transportation, and other tourism related trades in order to ensure
244 a high quality workforce is available to support large events, including the 2026 FIFA
245 World Cup, in a way that benefits families, community, and the region.

246 ER26 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

248 solely to provide civil legal aid support for (~~asylum~~) asylum seekers in King County.

249 ER27 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

250 Of this appropriation, \$500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
251 contract with Uplift NW to remodel or replace its facility on Western Avenue.

252 ER28 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

253 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
254 contract with Mary's Place for the development of an emergency shelter and low-income
255 housing in Burien.

256 ER29 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

257 Of this appropriation, \$71,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
258 with the United Way of King County for rental assistance.

259 ER30 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

260 Of this appropriation, \$400,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
261 contract with the United Way of King County for food security services.

262 ER31 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

263 Of this appropriation, \$67,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
264 with the Seatown F.C Academy.

265 ER32 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

266 Of this appropriation, \$477,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
267 contract with the White Center Food Bank.

268 ER33 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

Ordinance 19879

269 Of this appropriation, \$500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
270 contract with REACH for homelessness outreach.

271 ER34 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

272 Of this appropriation, \$150,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
273 contract with the Martin Luther King Labor for a virtual hiring hall.

274 ER35 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

275 Of this appropriation, \$851,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
276 contract with the Low-Income Housing Institute to provide housing and related operating
277 support for asylum seekers and refugees.

278 ER36 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

279 Of this appropriation, \$449,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
280 support housing, shelter, and services for asylum seekers provided by Riverton Park
281 United Methodist Church.

282 ER37 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

283 Of this appropriation, \$250,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
284 contract with the Issaquah Clothing and Food Bank.

285 ER38 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

286 Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
287 contract with SnoValley Pride.

288 ER39 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

289 Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
290 contract with Pride Across the Bridge.

292 Of this appropriation, \$500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for a
293 grant to Friends of Seattle Waterfront, dba Friends of Waterfront Seattle, to support the

295 ER41 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

296 Of this appropriation, \$350,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
297 contract with the King County Regional Homelessness Authority for extreme weather
298 response.

299 ER42 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

300 Of this appropriation, \$250,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
301 support Lake City Partners' Ending Homelessness for the operation of the Oaks enhanced
302 shelter in Shoreline.

303 ER43 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

304 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
305 with Leadership Eastside for educational and training programs.

306 ER44 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

307 Of this appropriation, \$250,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
308 support the Federal Way Public Schools Apprenticeship Program.

309 ER45 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

310 Of this appropriation, \$250,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
311 support the Auburn School District Apprenticeship Program.

312 ER46 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

313 Of this appropriation, \$200,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
314 contract with the Atlantic Street Center.

315 ER47 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

316 Of this appropriation, \$200,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
317 contract with the Skyway Coalition for youth activities.

318 ER48 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

319 Of this appropriation, \$200,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
320 contract with The Breakfast Group.

321 ER49 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

322 Of this appropriation, \$150,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
323 contract with the Africatown Community Land Trust for the Benu Community Home.

324 P1 PROVIDED THAT:

325 Of the moneys restricted by Expenditure Restriction ER4 of this section,
326 \$900,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until: (1) the executive transmits a site
327 study for a proposed new King County Search and Rescue Association headquarters and
328 a motion that should acknowledge receipt of the site study, and a motion that should
329 acknowledge receipt of the site study is passed by council; and (2) the executive transmits
330 a report as directed by Section 94, Proviso P1, of this ordinance regarding the moneys or
331 financial resources secured for the King County Search and Rescue Association's
332 proposed new headquarters site, as well as design and construction of its buildings and
333 other improvements ("the funding report") and a motion that should acknowledge receipt
334 of the funding report, and a motion that should acknowledge receipt of the funding report
335 is passed by council. The motions should reference the subject matter, the provisos'
336 ordinance number, ordinance sections and proviso numbers in both the title and body of
337 each motion.

338 The site study report shall include the following:

339 A. A description, which could include a schematic drawing, of the proposed
340 headquarters buildings and other improvements, including approximate square footage
341 and purpose of each building and other improvement. The description should also
342 identify the general geographical location of the proposed site and approximate size of
343 the site; and

344 B. An estimate of the total capital project cost, with a breakdown of cost
345 estimates to include but not be limited to the dollar amounts necessary to complete site
346 acquisition, design and engineering and construction.

347 The executive should electronically file the site study report and a motion
348 required by this proviso, no later than June 30, 2024, with the clerk of the council, who
349 shall retain an electronic copy and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the
350 council chief of staff and the lead staff for the transportation, economy and environment
351 committee or its successor.

352 P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

353 Of this appropriation, \$300,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
354 executive transmits a gun violence prevention and response plan and a motion that should
355 acknowledge receipt of the plan and a motion acknowledging receipt of the plan is passed
356 by council. The motion should reference the subject matter, the proviso's ordinance
357 number, ordinance section, and proviso number in both the title and body of the motion.

358 The plan shall include, but not be limited to, implementation details about the
359 following strategies:

360 A. Strategy 1: Strengthen systems and relationships. The plan must include a
361 plan to create a regional board for gun violence prevention and response intended to
362 strengthen collaboration and communication between entities responding to incidences of
363 gun violence, and entities working to prevent gun violence. The plan to create the
364 regional board should include, but not be limited to:

365 1. A description of the membership which should include people impacted by
366 gun violence, and representatives from community organizations, local jurisdictions,
367 school districts, public health - Seattle & King County ("PHSKC"), the King County
368 department of community and human services ("DCHS"), the King County regional
369 office of gun violence prevention, law enforcement agencies, King County courts,
370 prosecutors, and public defenders, and other King County departments;

371 2. The scope of work, what the regional board for gun violence prevention
372 would be responsible for reviewing, approving, or providing advice to the executive and
373 council on gun violence prevention and response initiatives;

374 3. How frequently the regional board for gun violence prevention would
375 convene, a description of the staff support the regional board would be provided, and a
376 proposed budget if recommended by the executive;

377 4. The regional board for gun violence prevention is encouraged to create
378 neighborhood specific workgroups focused on prevention in areas hardest hit by gun
379 violence; and

380 5. The plan shall be transmitted with a companion ordinance to codify the
381 regional board for gun violence prevention in King County Code;

382 B. Strategy 2: Create clear protocols. The plan shall include a plan to develop
383 and implement a standardized protocol for King County departments to follow in the
384 aftermath of gun violence incidents that have a jurisdictional or programmatic nexus with
385 King County government. For the purposes of this proviso, "have a jurisdictional or
386 programmatic nexus with King County government" includes, but is not limited to
387 violence that occurs in unincorporated King County; on, or, in a King County-owned
388 operation such as a Metro transit department bus or facility; in a school that has a King
389 County school-based health center; a school or community-based organization that
390 receives programmatic support from King County sales or property taxes; or areas that
391 are served by King County's office of gun violence prevention initiatives. This protocol
392 should outline the specific actions each department will take in the aftermath of gun
393 violence incidents;

394 C. Strategy 3: Resource Database and Deployment. The plan shall include the
395 development of a comprehensive database of resources readily available to support
396 victims, families, and communities impacted by gun violence. The database should
397 include resources available directly from King County, such as mental health resources,
398 and through partnerships with community organizations. Additionally, the executive
399 should create a plan for the deployment of these resources, prioritizing immediate support
400 for impacted families;

401 D. Strategy 4: Advance Targeted Interventions. The plan shall include a
402 description of how the executive will collaborate with partners in the criminal justice
403 system, Harborview Medical Center, and community-based organizations to identify
404 individuals at high risk of being involved in gun violence, either as perpetrators or

405 victims. In collaboration with those partners, the plan shall include a description of how
406 the regional board would create tailored intervention plans to divert these individuals
407 away from participating in gun violence. The intervention strategies may include, but are
408 not limited to, conflict mediation, therapy, anger management, mental health resources,
409 addiction recovery services, space activation, accountability measures, job opportunities,
410 and after-school activities; and

ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE

From time to time, King County-Department of 02 (we, us or Company) may be required by law to provide to you certain written notices or disclosures. Described below are the terms and conditions for providing to you such notices and disclosures electronically through the DocuSign system. Please read the information below carefully and thoroughly, and if you can access this information electronically to your satisfaction and agree to this Electronic Record and Signature Disclosure (ERSD), please confirm your agreement by selecting the check-box next to 'I agree to use electronic records and signatures' before clicking 'CONTINUE' within the DocuSign system.

Getting paper copies

At any time, you may request from us a paper copy of any record provided or made available electronically to you by us. You will have the ability to download and print documents we send to you through the DocuSign system during and immediately after the signing session and, if you elect to create a DocuSign account, you may access the documents for a limited period of time (usually 30 days) after such documents are first sent to you. After such time, if you wish for us to send you paper copies of any such documents from our office to you, you will be charged a \$0.00 per-page fee. You may request delivery of such paper copies from us by following the procedure described below.

Withdrawing your consent

If you decide to receive notices and disclosures from us electronically, you may at any time change your mind and tell us that thereafter you want to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format. How you must inform us of your decision to receive future notices and disclosure in paper format and withdraw your consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically is described below.

Consequences of changing your mind

If you elect to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format, it will slow the speed at which we can complete certain steps in transactions with you and delivering services to you because we will need first to send the required notices or disclosures to you in paper format, and then wait until we receive back from you your acknowledgment of your receipt of such paper notices or disclosures. Further, you will no longer be able to use the DocuSign system to receive required notices and consents electronically from us or to sign electronically documents from us.

All notices and disclosures will be sent to you electronically

Unless you tell us otherwise in accordance with the procedures described herein, we will provide electronically to you through the DocuSign system all required notices, disclosures, authorizations, acknowledgements, and other documents that are required to be provided or made available to you during the course of our relationship with you. To request delivery from us of paper copies of the notices and disclosures previously provided by us to you electronically, you must send us an email to cipriano.dacanay@kingcounty.gov and in the body of such request you must state your email address, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. We will bill you for any fees at that time, if any.

To withdraw your consent with King County-Department of 02

To inform us that you no longer wish to receive future notices and disclosures in electronic format you may:

- i. decline to sign a document from within your signing session, and on the subsequent page, select the check-box indicating you wish to withdraw your consent, or you may;
- ii. send us an email to cipriano.dacanay@kingcounty.gov and in the body of such request you must state your email, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. We do not need any other information from you to withdraw consent.. The consequences of your withdrawing consent for online documents will be that transactions may take a longer time to process..

Required hardware and software
