1 AN ORDINANCE updating references to the 2026-2031 2 Parks Levy in the parks and recreation fund and the parks 3 capital fund; and amending Ordinance 14793, Section 2, as 4 amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.480 and Ordinance 15966, 5 Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.490. 6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: 7 SECTION 1. Ordinance 14793, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.480 8 are hereby amended to read as follows: 9 A. There is hereby created the parks and recreation fund. 10 B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund. 11 C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the 12 manager of the fund. 13 D. The fund shall account for the receipt of tax levy revenues and other moneys, 14 and for the disbursement in accordance with ((this section)) the following: 1.a. The proceeds of the six-year property tax levy approved by the voters of 15 16 King County on August ((20, 2019)) 5, 2025, under Ordinance ((18890)) 19922, in 17 excess of the levy limitation in chapter 84.55 RCW, shall be deposited, in accordance 18 with Ordinance ((18890, Section 3)) 19922, Section 4, in a levy subfund of the parks and 19 recreation fund, or its successor((-));

20	b. The levy proceeds shall be used only for the eligible purposes specified in
21	Ordinance ((18890, Section 4, consistent with Ordinance 18890, Section 6.)) 19922,
22	Section 5:
23	c. The levy proceeds to be used for the purposes specified in Ordinance
24	((18890)) <u>19922</u> , Section ((4.C., D. and E.2)) <u>5.D., F., G., H., and I.2.</u> shall be transferred
25	to the parks capital fund created under K.C.C. 4A.200.490; and
26	d. The levy proceeds to be used for the purposes specified in Ordinance 19922,
27	Section 5.E., shall be transferred to the youth and amateur sports fund created under
28	K.C.C. 4A.200.810((-)); and
29	2. Any other moneys deposited in the fund shall be used for parks and recreation
30	purposes.
31	E. The fund shall be managed in such a way as to distinguish between proceeds
32	from levies approved under Ordinance ((18890)) 19922, business revenues, as well as
33	parks operating and maintenance expenditures, community grant program expenditures
34	and targeted equity grant program expenditures.
35	SECTION 2. Ordinance 15966, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.490
36	shall be amended to read as follows:
37	A. There is hereby created the parks capital fund.
38	B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is a capital projects fund.
39	C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the
40	manager of the fund.
41	D. The fund shall account for the receipt of tax levy revenues and other moneys,
42	and for the dishursement of other moneys for capital parks and recreation purposes

43	E. The proceeds of the six-year property tax levy approved by the voters of King
44	County on August 21, 2007, in the fund shall be used only for any of the following
45	eligible purposes:
46	1. Acquisition of open space and natural lands critical to the preservation of
47	regional watersheds and streams;
48	2. Acquisition and development of rights of way for regional trails, with
49	primary consideration given to those projects that address health disparities and health
50	inequities as recognized in the Health of King County 2006 report and are consistent with
51	the Regional Trails Plan including acquisition of missing critical links and/or
52	maximization of regional trail use;
53	3. Repayment of costs, including principal and interest, associated with interim
54	financing following approval of the levy; and
55	4. To provide up to five hundred thousand dollars annually for capital funding
56	of recreation grant programs.
57	F.1. The proceeds of the six-year levy approved by the voters of King County on
58	August 20, 2013, in the fund shall be used only for those purposes specified in Ordinance
59	17568, Section 4.B.
60	2. Any other moneys deposited in the fund shall be used for capital parks and
61	recreation purposes.
62	G.1. The proceeds of the six-year levy approved by the voters of King County on
63	August 20, 2019, in the fund shall be used only for those purposes specified in Ordinance
64	18890, Section 4.C., D., and E.2.

65	2. Any other moneys deposited in the fund shall be used for capital parks and
66	recreation purposes.
67	H.1. The proceeds of the six-year levy approved by the voters on King County on
68	August 5, 2025, in the fund shall be used only for those purposes specified in Ordinance
69	19922, Section 5.D., F., G., H., and I.2.
70	2. Any other moneys deposited in the fund shall be used for capital parks and
71	recreation purposes.
72	<u>I.</u> The moneys in the fund from the levies approved under Ordinances 15760,
73	17568 ((and)), 18890, and 19922 shall be used solely for the eligible purposes authorized
74	by the voters ((and shall not supplant existing funds used for those purposes)).

Getting paper copies
