1	STRIKING AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED MOTION 2025-0020, VERSION 1			
2	On page 1, beginning on line 6, strike everything through page 4, line 61, and insert:			
3	" WHEREAS, Metro transit department operator Shawn Yim was assaulted and			
4	fatally stabbed on December 18, 2024, while on duty, and			
5	WHEREAS, according to Metro transit department performance reports on safety			
6	and security, the Metro transit department experienced thirty-three reported assaults on			
7	transit operators during 2023, with many more unreported, and			
8	WHEREAS, a nighttime study conducted by the University of Washington in			
9	2023 on a total of eleven local buses and nineteen light rail train cars on routes across			
10	four different transit agencies detected methamphetamine in ninety-eight percent of			
11	surface samples and one hundred percent of air samples, and detected fentanyl in forty-			
12	six percent of surfaces and twenty-five percent of air samples, and			
13	WHEREAS, a survey of transit operators published by the University of			
14	Washington in 2024 indicated that eight-three percent of respondents reported observing			
15	passengers smoking drugs aboard their vehicles, twenty-seven percent of respondents			
16	reported that they had been physically attacked or assaulted by a passenger during the			
17	past year, and fifty percent of respondents indicated a likelihood to leave their job within			
18	the next year, and

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19	WHEREAS, increasing public safety on buses and at bus stops and transit centers		
20	is a responsibility that is the primary responsibility of the Metro transit department but		
21	requires strong partnership and support from the local jurisdictions in which it operates,		
22	and		
23	WHEREAS, increasing levels of homelessness, substance use disorder, and		
24	behavioral health challenges throughout King County have affected public safety and		
25	perceptions of safety on transit and at bus stops and transit centers, and		
26	WHEREAS, in a hearing of the King County council's committee of the whole on		
27	January 13, 2025, leadership of the Amalgamated Transit Union, Local 587, reiterated		
28	their call to convene a task force on transit safety and security, and		
29	WHEREAS, such a task force could be instrumental in bringing together		
30	communities and transit partners to address issues of community safety and the safety		
31	and security of local transit operations;		
32	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:		
33	A. The council requests that the executive work with Amalgamated Transit		
34	Union, Local 587 to establish a task force on transit safety and security with the goal of		
35	providing a response to transit safety and security in King County, including the		
36	jurisdictions in which the Metro transit department operates.		
37	B. The task force on transit safety and security should include, but not be limited		
38	to, representatives from the following:		
39	1. Amalgamated Transit Union, Local 587;		
40	2. Metro transit department front line transit operators;		
41	3. The King County sheriff or designee;		

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42	4. The King County executive or designee;			
43	5. The general manager of the Metro transit department or designee;			
44	6. The director of the department of community and human services or			
45	designee;			
46	7. Elected representatives, or designees, from local jurisdictions in which the			
47	Metro transit department operates;			
48	8. Law enforcement leaders, or designees, of local jurisdictions in which the			
49	Metro transit department operates;			
50	9. The Sound Transit chief executive officer or designee;			
51	10. Members of organizations representing transit riders; and			
52	11. Any other committee members deemed necessary.			
53	C. The task force on transit safety and security should develop a work plan that			
54	will address issues including, but not limited to, the following:			
55	1. Improvements to operator safety on Metro transit department buses, including			
56	a plan to install physical barriers for bus operators on both newly acquired and existing			
57	bus fleet;			
58	2. Strategies to hold public transit passengers, as well as others at bus stops and			
59	transit centers, accountable for abiding by the requirements for conduct on transit			
60	property, as specified in K.C.C. chapter 28.96, as well as local laws and regulations;			
61	3. Interagency coordination and shared responsibilities with the jurisdictions in			
62	which the Metro transit department operates;			
63	4. Coordination with Metro transit police, local law enforcement, communities,			
64	and transit riders to improve response times with the goal of improving both public safety
