17	Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
18	executive transmits a letter confirming that a dashboard for the restorative community
19	pathways program has been published or updated on the county website.
20	A. The dashboard shall include, but not be limited to detailed data on the monthly
21	and annual aggregate number of unique referrals by the prosecuting attorney's office and
22	by cohort, enrollments, declines, exits, and completions for the years 2022, 2023, and
23	2024, including the following:
24	1. The number of unique referrals by the prosecuting attorney's office;
25	2. The number of youths who were unable to be contacted, the number of youth
26	referred back to the prosecuting attorney's office for being unable to be contacted and, the
27	number of youth pending contact, including the average time from referral and the
28	current status or rereferral;
29	3. The number of youths who refused services, the number of youth referred
30	back to the prosecuting attorney's office for refusal of services, including the average
31	time between referral and rereferral for all categories;
32	4. The number of youth who enrolled in services, and the average time, the
33	range of times, and the distribution of times from when a youth is referred by the
34	prosecuting attorney's office to when they enrolled in services;
35	5. The number of youth who exited the program without completing the
36	program and, of that number, the number who are referred back to the prosecuting
37	attorney's office, including the average time, the range of times, and the distribution of
38	times from when a youth is referred to the program, enrolled in services to when the
39	youth exited the program without completing the program;

40	6. The number of youth completing the program, including the average time, the
41	range of times, and the distribution of times from when a youth enrolled in services to
12	when they completed the program; and
43	7. Working with the prosecuting attorney's office, determine the number of
14	referrals back to the prosecuting attorney's office that have been subsequently declined,

53	2. Comprehensive inventory of the programs available to youth referred to
54	restorative community pathways, including program structures, activities, timeline for
55	engaging in services, accountability metrics, and reporting structures;
56	3. Summary of the contracts between the department of community and human
57	services and the community-based organizations providing services to youth referred to
58	restorative community pathways in 2022, 2023, and 2024. The summary should include:
59	a. the contract amount, key terms, renewal schedules, minimum standards, and
60	reporting requirements for each organization. The executive shall include copies of each
51	contract with the report; and

b. enrollment statistics and outcomes for each contracted organization; and

63	4. A description of any improvements to the restorative community pathways
64	program being pursued or suggested by the department of community and human
65	services. The prosecuting attorney's office should be provided the opportunity to
66	comment on the improvements being pursued or suggested, and that response should be
67	included in the report.
68	The executive should electronically file the letter required by this proviso by
69	August 31, 2025, with the clerk of the council, who shall retain an electronic copy and
70	provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief of staff, and the lead
71	staff for the law and justice committee or its successor.
72	P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
73	Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
74	executive provides a briefing to the law and justice committee regarding the grant
75	allocation from the federal department of justice office of juvenile justice and
76	delinquency prevention for the restorative community pathways program. The briefing
77	shall include, but not be limited to:

79	development, including progress towards increasing professional development
