

MOTION NO. 123

WHEREAS the problem of crime in a free society is a most serious concern to citizens of King County, and

WHEREAS the criminal and the crimes he commits know no governmental jurisdictional boundaries; know no limits to his activities and his flight; and

WHEREAS the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice has recommended:

"Each metropolitan area and each county should take action directed towards the pooling, or consolidation of police services through the particular technique that will provide the most satisfactory law enforcement service and protection at lowest possible cost."

and;

WHEREAS the County Executive has proposed specific areas of consideration for consolidation of services based upon an objective of most effective law enforcement for the people of the metropolitan area;

NOW THEREFORE be it moved that the King County Council commends Executive Spellman and the Mayor of Seattle and urges them to carefully study consolidation of services for law enforcement and make recommendations to the County and City Councils when policy conclusions are required.
