WHEREAS, in 1960 the County of King commenced a flood control
program, in conjunction with the continuing study by the Corps of
Engineers, whereby flood control bonds were subsequently sold and

considerable work was accomplished on a continuing basis to control

River and Tributaries by the United States Army, Corps of Engineers,

damage done by the Snoqualmie River at flood stage, and

WHEREAS, in a letter to the United States Army, Corps of Engineers, dated January 11th, 1967, the Board of King County Commissioners agreed to sponsor multi-purpose flood control dams on the Middle Fork of the Snoqualmie River and further agreed to implement local controls in the river valley in coordination with said dam projects, and

WHEREAS, in an updated report of December 18, 1969, Colonel R. E. McConnell, District Engineer, United States Army Corps of Engineers, concluded that the construction of a dam and reservoir on the Middle Fork, Snoqualmie River, for flood control, power, fish and wildlife, and recreation is needed and justified,

THEREFORE, the County Council of the County of King hereby reaffirms the local sponsorship of this dam and reservoir, as stated in the aforementioned letter by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of King, State of Washington, dated January 11th, 1967.
