WHEREAS, the Director of the State Department of Natural Resources has announced plans to offer more than 150,000 acres of Puget Sound tidelands, beds and uplands, for oil and gas exploration leases, and

WHEREAS, there have been major oil spills due to off-shore well drilling such as the one in Santa Barbara, California, that covered 800 square miles of ocean and 40 miles of beach, and the Louisiana spill in excess of 18,000 barrels of oil into the Gulf of Mexico, and

WHEREAS, off-shore platform drilling of oil wells creates a risk of oil leaks which will cause damage to the Puget Sound area, including the wildlife that exists therein, and

WHEREAS, the salmon fishing industry could be endangered by platform drilling for oil in the Puget Sound area, and

WHEREAS, one section of the area to be offered for oil and gas exploration leases is adjacent to the King County line off of King County shores from Point Defiance to Alki Point and west to Vashon Island's eastern shore, and

WHEREAS, King County has a major and substantial interest in the activity on Puget Sound,

NOW THEREFORE, the King County Council urges the State to pass legislation prohibiting off-shore drilling but which will not prohibit the possibility of reaching oil and gas by slant drilling from the land if and when techniques improve that will insure preservation of the Puget Sound Area environment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Motion be sent to the Governor of the State of Washington, the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, members of the Washington State Senate, members of the Washington State House of Representatives, and the King County Executive.
