3 WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a major contribu-
4 tor to the economic, social, religious, educational and cultural
5 progress of our nation,

6 WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. had an especially
7 important role in the minority communities as the catalyst for
8 progress within those areas,

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. dedicated his life to
10 the fulfillment of the dream that all men are created equal,

11 WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a drum major for
12 truth, peace, love (through non-violent means),

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County
14 that Friday, January 15, 1971, be proclaimed Dr. Martin Luther King,
15 Jr. Day, in order that all citizens may reflect upon and rededicate
16 themselves to solving the problems he addressed, bearing in mind
17 that discrimination and social injustices in all their forms are
18 destructive of the nation's unity and, therefore, its strength.
