WHEREAS, the SEA-KING alert system, the first module in a Seattle-King County Law and Justice Information network has proven to be highly effective in aiding law enforcement agencies in King County by providing a central file of all active arrest warrants, and

WHEREAS, the development of a second module in the Seattle-King County Law and Justice Information network which would capture, account for, process and report on citations for moving traffic violations would further aid law and justice agencies in the Seattle-King County area, and

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle intends to participate with King County in the development and implementation of this traffic citation processing system, and

WHEREAS, the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, as amended, provides for the making of grants by the U. S. Department of Justice through the Law and Justice Planning Office, Community Affairs Agency, State of Washington;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of King County, Washington, as follows:

1. That an application be made to the Law and Justice Planning Office for grant funds to develop and implement a traffic citation system.

2. That the County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute and to file such application with the Law and Justice Planning Office and to execute such contracts as are required by said office.

3. That the Federal/State Grant Coordinator is hereby authorized to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by the Law and Justice Planning Office and to act as the authorized correspondent for King County.

4. That the United States of America, Department of Justice and the State of Washington, are hereby assured full compliance with such regulations effectuating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
