

KING COUNTY MOTION 557

A MOTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR AN OUTDOOR RECREATION PROJECT TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY THE MARINE RECREATION LAND ACT AND THE \$40,000,000 OUTDOOR RECREATION BOND ISSUE OF 1968

WHEREAS, King County, Washington, desires to acquire fee simple title to certain land listed below which were authorized by the voters of King County on February 13, 1968, and by King County Resolution #34571 and which are to be held and used for permanent open-space land for park and recreational purposes and:

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act, and the \$40,000,000 Outdoor Recreation Bond Issue of 1968 state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; and:

WHEREAS, the County Council, King County, Washington, considers it in the best public interest to acquire the following park:

Highline Neighborhood Park #10	3.96	\$159,000

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of King County, Washington:

1. That the County Executive is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for fund assistance towards the total acquisition of the above-mentioned park, and to execute such contracts as are required by said department;
2. That this project will be undertaken contingent to the approval of both state and federal funds for this acquisition.
3. That the Federal and State Grant Coordinator for King County is hereby designated as the authorized correspondent to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by said agency;
4. That any of the aforementioned property acquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency, and
5. That this motion becomes a part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
