Section 2: The King County Council will sit as a board of equalization for the purpose of considering aforesaid assessment roll at aforesaid hearing or hearings and will consider such objections as are made thereto or any part thereof, and will correct, revise, raise, lower, change or modify said rolls or any part thereof, or set aside said roll in order that such assessment be made de novo, as to such body shall appear just and equitable, and then proceed to confirm the same by ordinance.

Section 3: The Administrator-Clerk of the King County Council is hereby directed to give notice of hearing upon said roll to all owners or reputed owners of the property whose name appears thereon by mailing a notice thereof at least fifteen (15)

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days before the date fixed for the hearing to such owners or reputed owners at the address of such as shown on the tax rolls of the County Treasurer; in addition thereto, such notices shall be published at least two (2) times in a newspaper of general circulation in the County. Such notices shall specify the time and place of hearing on said roll and shall notify all persons who may desire to object thereto to make such objections in writing and to file same with the Administrator-Clerk of the Council at or prior to the date fixed for said hearing.
