1 A MOTION authorizing the County Executive
2 to execute and submit a grant application
3 to the State Law & Justice Planning Office
4 for funds in the amount of \$99,670 to
enable the office of the Public Defender
to continue the Corrections Counseling
project, 73-L-326.

5 WHEREAS, the omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act
6 of 1968, as amended, provides for the award of grants by the Law
7 Enforcement Assistance Administration, U.S. Department of Justice
8 through the Washington State Law & Justice Planning Office, and

9 WHEREAS, the County Council recognizes the need to comply
10 with Superior Court regulations governing pre-sentence reports
11 by defense counsel, and

12 WHEREAS, this project will increase the opportunity for
13 proper court evaluation at sentencing, and

14 WHEREAS, King County recognizes its obligation to provide
15 \$20,262 in-kind contribution and to provide \$15,166 in a cash
16 match for support of this project,

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

18 1. That the King County Executive is hereby authorized to
19 make application for funds in the amount of \$99,670 to the State
20 Law and Justice Planning Office on behalf of King County;

21 2. That the County Executive is hereby authorized and
22 directed to file and execute such application and contracts as
23 are required by the State;

24 3. That the Federal/State Relations Division is named the
25 authorized correspondent for King County and is further authorized
26 to furnish such additional information and documents as may
27 be required by the State;

28 4. That the County Executive is also authorized to enter
29 into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the
30 implementation of the project.
