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MOTION NO. <u>1478</u>

A MOTION relating to surface water, watershed management and protection, and the creation of a county-wide Surface Water Utility; and establishing a board to determine and recommend the necessary steps for the creation of this Utility.

WHEREAS the Washington State Water Pollution Control
Commission Planning Guide, published March 31, 1970, sets forth
State objectives for comprehensive water resource planning, with
a specific category including such items as soil erosion, storm
drainage or runoff; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such State Planning Guide, King County, the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle,
all cities, sewer districts, and water districts are developing
a comprehensive regional water resource plan under the River
Basin Coordinating Committee; and

WHEREAS said plan among its many elements addresses the problem of urban runoff and storm drainage; and

WHEREAS it is the intent of all jurisdictions participating in this study to institute action based on the recommendations of this study; and

WHEREAS the King County Environmental Development Commission, upon request of King County Executive order dated January 20, 1971, completed the "Storm Water and Water Courses" report. Said report concludes "that there is lack of available policy and effective legislation" and "there is a proliferation, fragmentation, and overlap of political subdivisions dealing with parts of the whole system, none of which is now dealing with whole system;" and

WHEREAS the King County Environmental Development Commission has, in addition, released the "Open Space-Section II Wetlands Element" report with the stated goal: "Wetland areas that have value for water retention, wildlife habitat, and general open space shall be retained in a natural condition;" and

WHEREAS there presently exists in county government no specific utility or funding source to carry out the intent of the urban runoff and storm drainage obligation of the comprehensive water resources plan; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of RCW 36.94, the "County Services Act", the County may engage in the construction, operation, and maintenance of a system of storm drainage; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of RCW 39.34, the "Inter-local Cooperation Act", local governmental units are enabled to cooperate on the basis of mutual advantage;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> <u>NEW SECTION.</u> The necessary steps shall be
taken to determine the feasibility of and establish a Surface
Water Utility in the unincorporated areas of King County in
accordance with the intentions expressed in this motion. Said
Utility shall include all municipalities within King County
requesting inclusion.

SECTION 2. NEW SECTION. King County will administer this proposed Surface Water Utility. King County will exercise all legal powers necessary and appropriate to the construction, condemnation and purchase, acquisition, addition to, maintenance, conduct and operation, management, regulation and control of all surface waters within the jurisdiction of this Utility, including, without limitation, all the lawful powers to fix, regulate, and control the rates, charges and conditions, for the use thereof.

SECTION 3. NEW SECTION. The Division Engineer, Hydraulics Division, Department of Public Works shall be ex officio administrator of the proposed County Surface Water Utility.

SECTION 4. NEW SECTION. All natural and man-made surface water and storm water systems within the boundaries of the proposed Utility shall be considered for inclusion as a part of the Utility.

SECTION 5. NEW SECTION. A Surface Water Utility Board is hereby created to determine the feasibility of and recommend the necessary steps in establishing a Surface Water Utility in King County. The Board shall:

- determine the practicality of achieving the unified management of storm and surface water through the mechanism of a Surface Water Utility;
- delineate procedures which the County must follow in establishing a Surface Water Utility; and
- prepare an Ordinance for Council consideration which properly provides for the creation of a Surface Water Utility.

The Board's report shall be presented to the Council no later than 6 months subsequent to the passage of this motion. The Board shall have, as a minimum, a representative from each of the following:

King County Department of Public Works and Transportation;
Seattle-King County Health Department (Sanitation);
King County Department of Community & Environmental Development;

King County Department of Budget & Program Planning; King County Council Administrator's Office

King County Prosecuting Attorney's Office (Civil Division).

King County Environmental Development Commission's Public Utilities Committee Chairman, or his designee.
