

MOTION NO. 1766

A MOTION authorizing application for funding assistance for an outdoor recreation project to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation as provided by the Marine Recreation Land Act and by Referendum 28, a \$40,000,000 Public Recreation Facility Bond Fund authorized by the voters of the State of Washington, November 7, 1972.

WHEREAS, King County, Washington, desires to acquire fee simple title to certain land listed below as authorized by the voters of King County on February 13, 1968, and by King County Resolution #34571 and which is to be held and used for permanent open-space land for park and recreational purposes, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act and by Referendum 28, a \$40,000,000 Public Recreation Facility Bond authorized by the voters of the State of Washington, November 7, 1972, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies, and

WHEREAS, the Council of King County considers it in the best public interest to acquire the park listed below:

Cedar River Regional Park Stage I	Approximately 82.76
Estimated Cost: \$519,500	

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The County Executive is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for fund assistance towards the total acquisition of the above-mentioned park, and to execute such contracts as are required by said department;
2. This project will be undertaken contingent to the approval of both state and federal funds for this acquisition;
3. The Federal and State Relations Division for King County is hereby designated as the authorized correspondent to provide additional


1 information and to furnish such documents as may be required by said agency;

2 4. Any of the aforementioned property acquired with financial aid
3 through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation is to be placed
4 in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in
5 perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the the King
6 County Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any
7 affected federal agency; and

8 5. This motion becomes a part of a formal application to the Inter-
9 agency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
