## MOTION NO. 1800

A MOTION authorizing nine temporary positions in the Public Employment Program.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2112 appropriates \$1,277,100 to the Public Employment Program commencing July 1, 1974, through March 31, 1975, and

WHEREAS, King County is entitled to receive up to 9 million dollars over the next three years under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, and

WHEREAS, extensive plans and applications must be prepared prior to March 1, 1975, and

WHEREAS, funds to prepare these plans have not been provided in either the current budget or the 1975 Executive's budget request and

WHEREAS, advance federal monies will not be available to King County until January 1975 to accomplish these tasks,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Executive is authorized and directed to establish the following temporary Housing and Community Development positions until January 30, 1975 or the receipt of advance federal planning monies, whichever date is sooner:

Employees hired to fill these positions shall be administratively transferred from Public Employment Program funded positions to Community Development Act funded positions, upon receipt of advance federal planning monies.

Personnel hired to fill these positions will be hired in accordance with all regulations and policies of the Public Employment Program.

No Public Employment funds will be expended to subsidize the individual salaries of hired personnel in excess of the authorized monthly rate.

In those cases where a position classification represents a beginning salary level in excess of the authorized monthly rate, the Executive shall prepare an ordinance appropriating the necessary funds to reimburse employed individuals for the difference between their starting salary and maximum salaries allowed under the Public Employment Program.

The Executive and his staff shall prepare, by no later than November 15, answers, in writing, to the following questions which shall be reviewed by the Council:

- 1. What procedures will be implemented to provide adequate and early opportunity for the Council to consider policy decisions relating to the Housing and Community Development Act, prior to the formal completion of plans and application for funds?
- 2. By what specific date, prior to the completion of plans and applications, will the Council consider the policy implication of proposed County programs or activities which may be phased out by this ACT? What will be the expected impact? Implication?
- 3. What new authorities are available to urban counties compared to existing programs and authorities which may be considered for phasing out?

1	4. Under the Housing and Community Development Act, what
2	new relationships are possible with special and general units of
3	government?
4	5. What indicators of community development need will be
5	developed in completing plans and applications?
6	6. What guidelines will be used in developing community
7	objectives?
