

MOTION NO. 1836

A MOTION adopting in concept the recommendations of the Steering Committee of the Policy Development Commission regarding the comprehensive planning process of King County and directing the revision of Ordinance 263.

WHEREAS, one of the first actions of the King County Council was to adopt through Ordinance 263 a comprehensive planning process for King County, and

WHEREAS, it is the continuing intention of the Council for King County to remain a leader in developing and applying responsive and effective comprehensive plans, and

WHEREAS, changing conditions, the advent of community planning and executive department reorganization make it necessary to consider revisions to the comprehensive planning process, and

WHEREAS, an ad hoc committee of the Policy Development Commission has considered this matter extensively over the past several months and their report has been recommended to the Council for adoption.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

That the attached recommendations of the Steering Committee of the Policy Development Commission for revision of the comprehensive planning process are adopted in concept.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED, that the Council recognizes the need for expanded and specific joint efforts between the Council and Executive staffs to implement these recommendations and directs that as a matter of priority Ordinance 263 be revised to reflect these recommendations.


