32 33 A MOTION expressing Council guidelines

and priorities for the 1976-81 Capital Improvement Program.

WHEREAS, Motion No. 1924 calls for meetings by the Policy Development Commission and the King County Council to solicit citizen views concerning County Capital Improvement Programs; and

WHEREAS, these hearings have now been completed; and

WHEREAS, the County is now in the process of preparing its 1976-1981 Capital Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the 1976-1981 Capital Improvement Programs should incorporate citizen priorities as communicated to their Council representatives:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: Council policy for development of the Capital Improvement Program is that:

Community organizations should be encouraged to operate and maintain neighborhood park facilities after development;

Maintenance of present facilities without reduction in services should be assured before additional park facilities are developed;

Park and Road projects in the CIP document shall be limited to those for which funds are reasonably anticipated to be available; unfunded projects shall be listed in a separate document;

Opportunities for joint application to whatever funding sources are available should be investigated for development of joint projects such as a Regional Zoo, Seattle Center Improvements Home of the Good Shepherd, Aquarium, Discovery Park and Sand Point

The 1976-1981 CIP should contemplate:

Development of a trail from the north point of the Burke-Gilman Trail to Blythe Park;

Investigating opportunities for securing funding for completing the bicycle path around Lake Sammamish and adding a bicycle lane to East Sammamish Road like the one on West Lake Sammamish Parkway;

Development of playfields in the East Lake Sammamish Plateau area;

Development of a bicycle trail separate from roadways in the Bellevue area;

Cooperation with Kent in development of a regional park including, possibly, tennis courts;

Improved drainage and flood control in the area of Swamp Creek;

Joint development with the City of Redmond of extension of N.E. 104th Street from the Redmond Forward Thrust pool Easterly to the Avondale Road;

Development of a governmental center in the Kenmore area in cooperation with Fire District No. 16, King County Library, Metro and other governmental agencies;

Dredging the Sammamish River below the 78th Street Bridge; Dredging the Kenmore Harbor Area:

Establishing a task force for design of Juanita Drive;

Giving priority in the Northshore area to the North Precinct Station; Lake Washington - Seattle North Trail (007152); Big Finn Hill (04041); Northeast Lake Washington (060051); Northshore #1 (081301); Northshore #2 (081311); Lake Forest Community (081732); Northshore Pool (090111); Swamp Creek (070051); McAleer Creek (070072); 40th Place Northeast (100572); Kenmore Beautification Project (101172); Northeast 205th Street (101173); 61st Avenue N.E (107471); Ecological Restoration (300174); 1974 Pathway Program (300274); Juanita Drive (200372);

Giving priority in the Shoreline Area to beautification of the King County Transfer Station, investigating the possibility of

obtaining 3 acres from the State for a park and leading a community planning effort to develop a 10 acre park including tennis courts; an area pea patch; obtaining property from the City Water Department for Hamlin Park, cutting the underbrush and expanding overnight camping; completing development at Ronald Bog; development for a boat launch and day tie-up dock at Richmond Beach; acquisition of the 40-acre Shoreview High School site adjacent to the Highlands Watershed Park; assisting the community in developing Echo Lake Park; construction of ponds to ameliorate surface water problems; road improvement as developed in the PDC Capital Improvement Committee Report on the Shoreline area meeting March 27, 1975 and shown on page 5 of that report.
