

MOTION NO. 2056

1 A MOTION expressing Council guidelines
2 and priorities for the 1976-81 Capital
3 Improvement Program.

4 WHEREAS, Motion No. 1924 calls for meetings by the Policy
5 Development Commission and the King County Council to solicit
6 citizen views concerning County Capital Improvement Programs; and

7 WHEREAS, these hearings have now been completed; and

8 WHEREAS, the County is now in the process of preparing its
9 1976-1981 Capital Improvement Program; and

10 WHEREAS, the 1976-1981 Capital Improvement Programs should
11 incorporate citizen priorities as communicated to their Council
12 representatives:

13 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

14 Council policy for development of the Capital Improvement
15 Program is that:

16 Community organizations should be encouraged to operate and
17 maintain neighborhood park facilities after development;

18 Maintenance of present facilities without reduction in
19 services should be assured before additional park facilities are
20 developed;

21 Park and Road projects in the CIP document shall be limited
22 to those for which funds are reasonably anticipated to be
23 available; unfunded projects shall be listed in a separate
24 document;

25 Opportunities for joint application to whatever funding
26 sources are available should be investigated for development of
27 joint projects such as a Regional Zoo, Seattle Center Improvements,
28 Home of the Good Shepherd, Aquarium, Discovery Park and Sand Point.

29 The 1976-1981 CIP should contemplate:

30 Development of a trail from the north point of the Burke-
31 Gilman Trail to Blythe Park;

1 Investigating opportunities for securing funding for
2 completing the bicycle path around Lake Sammamish and adding a
3 bicycle lane to East Sammamish Road like the one on West Lake
4 Sammamish Parkway;

5 Development of playfields in the East Lake Sammamish Plateau
6 area;

7 Development of a bicycle trail separate from roadways in the
8 Bellevue area;

9 Cooperation with Kent in development of a regional park
10 including, possibly, tennis courts;

11 Improved drainage and flood control in the area of Swamp
12 Creek;

13 Joint development with the City of Redmond of extension of
14 N.E. 104th Street from the Redmond Forward Thrust pool Easterly
15 to the Avondale Road;

16 Development of a governmental center in the Kenmore area in
17 cooperation with Fire District No. 16, King County Library, Metro
18 and other governmental agencies;

19 Dredging the Sammamish River below the 78th Street Bridge;

20 Dredging the Kenmore Harbor Area:

21 Establishing a task force for design of Juanita Drive;

22 Giving priority in the Northshore area to the North Precinct
23 Station; Lake Washington - Seattle North Trail (007152); Big Finn
24 Hill (04041); Northeast Lake Washington (060051); Northshore #1
25 (081301); Northshore #2 (081311); Lake Forest Community (081732);
26 Northshore Pool (090111); Swamp Creek (070051); McAleer Creek
27 (070072); 40th Place Northeast (100572); Kenmore Beautification
28 Project (101172); Northeast 205th Street (101173); 61st Avenue N.E.
29 (107471); Ecological Restoration (300174); 1974 Pathway Program
30 (300274); Juanita Drive (200372);

31 Giving priority in the Shoreline Area to beautification of
32 the King County Transfer Station, investigating the possibility of
33

1 obtaining 3 acres from the State for a park and leading a
 2 community planning effort to develop a 10 acre park including
 3 tennis courts; an area pea patch; obtaining property from the City
 4 Water Department for Hamlin Park, cutting the underbrush and
 5 expanding overnight camping; completing development at Ronald Bog;
 6 development for a boat launch and day tie-up dock at Richmond
 7 Beach; acquisition of the 40-acre Shoreview High School site
 8 adjacent to the Highlands Watershed Park; assisting the community
 9 in developing Echo Lake Park; construction of ponds to ameliorate
 10 surface water problems; road improvement as developed in the PDC
 11 Capital Improvement Committee Report on the Shoreline area meeting
 12 March 27, 1975 and shown on page 5 of that report.
