

A MOTION granting an easement in favor of King County Water District No. 124 over Federal Way Neighborhood Park No. 9.

WHEREAS, King County Water District No. 124, a municipal corporation of King County, Washington, has made application for the right to construct and maintain a water line under and across a strip of land which is a portion of Federal Way Neighborhood Park Site No. 9, and

WHEREAS, investigation reveals that it would be to the County's advantage to grant to Water District No. 124 the easement described herein for the consideration of mutual benefits, and

WHEREAS, it is determined to be necessary and in the best interests of the citizens of King County that the said easement be granted,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The County Executive is authorized to sign and deliver the necessary water line agreement, granting to Water District No. 124 the easement described as follows:

That portion of the following easement lying within a parcel of land deeded to King County, Washington, dated February 25, 1970, as recorded under Auditor's File No. 6623271, records of King County, Washington, Volume 295 of Deeds, Page 649, in the West 1/2 of Section 13, Township 21 North, Range 3 East, W.M., King County, Washington, described as follows:

An easement 10 feet in width, the centerline of which is 20 feet Northerly and Easterly of, and parallel to, the following described line:

Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of S.W. 330th Street and the Westerly margin of Village Park Division C, as recorded in Volume 71 of Plats, page 10, records of King County, Washington; Thence North 89°01'46" West along the centerline extension of S.W. 330th Street 555.11 feet; Thence North 4°08'14" East 208.11 feet to a point on a curve from which the radial center bears North 85°51'46" West 980.00 feet; Thence along the arc of said curve concave to the left 206.78 feet; Thence North 7°57'08" West 134.88 feet to the intersection of the centerline of 32nd Avenue S.W. and the Southerly margin of Woodvale, as recorded in Volume 85 of Plats, Pages 25 & 26, records of King County, Washington, said intersection being the terminus of this line description.
