MOTION NO.

A MOTION relating to the development of policy and criteria related to the extraction and

processing of sand, gravel, rock, and/or soil in King County.

WHEREAS, all removal and processing of sand, gravel, rock, and soil in unincorporated King County must take place in an area zoned Quarrying-Mining or must be subject to an unclassified use permit, and

WHEREAS, the issuance of unclassified use permits for extractive activities is based upon policies found in the following three sources:

- a. Section 21.44.010 and Section 21.44.020 of the King County Zoning Code, regarding unclassified uses; and
- b. Section C. policies 9, 10 and 11 of the King County Comprehensive Plan regarding extractive industries; and
- c. Motion 256 adopted by the King County Council on July 6, 1970, outlining an "Interim Statement of Policy on Mineral Resources", and

WHEREAS, the policies found in the above cited sections of the County Zoning Code and Comprehensive Plan and the Interim Statement of Policy constitute broad and general policy and do not include specific criteria to govern the location and operation for extraction and processing of natural resources in King County, and

WHEREAS, each application of unclassified use permits for the extraction of resources has constituted separate development policy for each specific site due, in part, to the absence of specific and comprehensive criteria regarding resource extraction,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. In order to develop a comprehensive and detailed policy governing the extraction and processing of natural resources in unincorporated King County, the Department of Planning and

the firm .

Community Development is hereby designated as the lead agency to carry out the following tasks:

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- a. Assess the distribution and type of extractive material resources in King County utilizing existing date.
- b. Propose, to the County Council, policy and program alternatives concerning the location and operation of extraction and processing activities in King County. Program and/or policy proposals shall include the following:
- 1) criteria to evaluate proposed extraction and processing sites.
- 2) policies and/or criteria to evaluate the relationship of the extractive or processing activity to adjacent land uses.
- 3) criteria to evaluate the off site impact of extractive and processing activities.
- 2. The study on resource extraction and processing and presentation of proposals to the County Council shall be completed during 1976.
- 3. The Council hereby requests the Department of Planning and Community Development to advise the Council throughout the stages of the study on policies and criteria for extractive and processing activities.
