

MOTION NO. 2261

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2 A MOTION endorsing the 4-2T-4 design for I-90,  
3 rejecting the alternative to withdraw the  
interstate designation in the I-90 corridor.

4 WHEREAS, Substitute House Bill 1141, signed July 2, 1975,  
5 directed the Puget Sound Council of Governments to complete any  
6 authorized phases of mass transit substitution study by  
7 November 1, 1975, and

8 WHEREAS, the King County Council (7/21/75), and the City  
9 Councils of Bellevue (7/14/75) and Seattle (7/7/75) officially  
10 supported the authorization of a mass transit substitution  
11 alternatives study, and

12 WHEREAS, the Phase 2 study, "I-90: Highway/Transit  
13 Alternatives" was released on December 19, 1975, and

14 WHEREAS, the Ninth Circuit Court of appeals in San Francisco  
15 on June 12, 1974, upheld its earlier ruling which required a new  
16 corridor/design hearing, the availability of an Environmental  
17 Impact Statement prior to and at the hearing, and the preparation  
18 of a final EIS following the hearing, and

19 WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Highways released  
20 its "Draft Environmental Impact/Section 4(f) Statement" on  
21 December 12, 1975, and

22 WHEREAS, Substitute House Bill 1141 requires each of the  
23 four involved local jurisdictions by January 15, 1976, to  
24 officially "approve or disapprove a request to withdraw from the  
25 interstate system the segments of state route no. 90 between (the)  
26 south Bellevue interchange and the Connecticut Street  
27 interchange on state route no. 5",  
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NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The Council endorses a design of 4-2T-4, with an initial configuration of 3-2T-3 which allows for the future expansion of capacity to a 4-2T-4 or other configuration, to accomodate public transit if such a facility is required, and
- 2. The Council rejects the alternative to withdraw the interstate designation in the I-90 corridor between the south Bellevue interchange and the Connecticut Street interchange on I-5.
