2 A MOTION allocating King County's 1976
3 Community Development Block Grant "population"
4 funds and forwarding projects to the Joint
5 Policy Committee to be considered for "County-
6 wide needs" and "discretionary" funds.

7 WHEREAS, King County, twenty-six suburban cities and the
8 Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, as an "urban County" consortium, will
9 receive \$3,340,000 of Community Development Block Grant funds by
10 July, 1976, for the 1976 - 77 funding year, and

11 WHEREAS, the King County Council's priorities for \$1,191,720
12 in "population" funds, \$953,376 in "Countywide needs" funds, and
13 \$450,708 in "discretionary" funds will be established by this
14 Motion, and

15 WHEREAS, there has been significant citizen involvement in
16 developing this proposed 1976 Community Development Program, and

17 WHEREAS, this program is consistent with the Community
18 Development "Proposal Guides" adopted by the Council,

19 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

20 The projects in the funding categories and amounts specified
21 on the attached list are adopted as King County's 1976 - 77
22 Community Development Program, provided that:

23 1. 297 Jones Road Slide Storm Drain System. Building and
24 other developmental permits will not be issued in the immediate
25 hazard area as long as the substantial risk of slides continues.
26 The Department of Public Works is requested to work with the
27 Division of Building and Land Development in defining the bounda-
28 ries of the hazard area. The situation should be reviewed with
29 the Council's Public Facilities and Utilities Committee when this
30 project is completed.

- 2. 189 Community Center--Vashon
- 176 Community Center--Snoqualmie Valley
- 201 Community Center--Maple Valley
- 183 Senior Center--White Center

Block Grant funds may be expended on these projects only after the County has received and approved a plan for making the projects self-supporting within two years.

3. 158 Black Diamond Sewers

Contracts and agreements signed for this project must contain a commitment that connections to the interceptor will not be permitted without the specific approval of the governmental agency with lawful authority to zone the area to be served by the connection.

- 180 Northshore Land Acquisition
- 154 Cedar River Trail
- 214 Burien Land Acquisition
- 194 Bothell Playfield
- 298 Normandy Park Park Acquisition

Reallocated Forward Thrust funds shall be used for each of these projects wherever possible. In the event that Forward Thrust funds are not available, Block Grant discretionary funds shall be used in conformance with Section 68, Subsection 1, of Ordinance No. 2544, the budget ordinance for King County for 1976.
