

MOTION NO. 2568

A MOTION renaming the Tolt River Bicentennial Park as the John MacDonald Memorial Park in recognition of Mr. MacDonald's personal contribution to the Bicentennial park project and the youth of the Pacific Northwest.

WHEREAS, members of the Boy Scouts of America and the United States Army Reserve have been progressing in the development of the Tolt River Bicentennial Park which is scheduled for an opening ceremony on June 26, 1976, and

WHEREAS, John MacDonald, who died May 10, 1976, was the Bicentennial Project Manager for the park project for the Chief Seattle Council of the Boy Scouts of America, and

WHEREAS, John MacDonald was the driving spirit behind the project that has resulted in the combined efforts of over 20,000 Cubs, Scouts, Explorers, and Leaders of the Chief Seattle Council working with King County agencies and members of the United States Army Reserve uniting in the construction of what is believed to be the nation's largest Bicentennial project, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Council that the efforts and examples of community spirit exemplified by John MacDonald should not go unrecognized now or in the future,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Tolt River Bicentennial Park is hereby renamed the John MacDonald Memorial Park in recognition of Mr. MacDonald's personal contribution to the Bicentennial park project and the youth of the Pacific Northwest.
