MOTION NO.

WHEREAS, the current county facilities at the Harborview

Medical Center for the care and treatment of the sick and injured

are not adequate to meet the present needs for such care and

treatment, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the county to acquire new and improved equipment for the Medical Center, construct a modern burn treatment facility and remodel and modernize existing facilities to meet new health care needs and new life safety and accreditation standards, and

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes that to implement necessary improvements it is necessary for the county to incur a general indebtedness by issuing its general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$19,500,000, and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Washington require that incurring such indebtedness and issuing the resultant bonds is an issue which must be considered and ratified by the people at a special county election, and

WHEREAS, the Council by Ordinance No. 2831, passed unanimously August 16, and signed by the Executive August 23, 1976; authorizing the placing of the bond issue on the ballot of the General Election to be held November 2, 1976.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
