2 A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to execute and
3 submit applications to the U.S. Economic Development
4 Administration for funds under Title I of the Local
Public Works Employment Act of 1976 and repealing Motion
No. 2725.

5 WHEREAS, Title of the Local Public Works Employment Act of 1976 provides
6 for the award of funds by the Economic Development Administration, U.S.
7 Department of Commerce, to fund local government public works projects, and

8 WHEREAS, the King County Council recognizes that King County has
9 several needed public works projects which will provide long term benefits
10 to the citizens of King County as well as provide employment opportunities
11 to the unemployed, and

12 WHEREAS, the costs of some projects have been adjusted to reflect
13 refined design estimates, and

14 WHEREAS, additional projects have been requested since passage of
15 Motion No. 2725, and

16 WHEREAS, new regulations governing implementation of the Local Public
17 Works Employment Act have been published since passage of Motion No. 2725,

18 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

19 1. Motion No. 2725 passed October 4, 1976 is hereby repealed.

20 2. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to make applications
21 for funds under Title I of the Public Works Employment Act of 1976 for
22 projects contained on the Public Works project sheet attached hereto.

23 3. The County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to file and
24 execute such applications and contracts as are required by the Economic
25 Development Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce.


26 4. The Program Development Division is named the authorized correspon-
27 dent for King County, and is further authorized to furnish such additional
28 information and documents as may be required by the Economic Development
29 Administration.

1 5. The County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute
2 such construction contracts as are necessary for the implementation of
3 successful project applications.

4 6. The United States of America, Department of Justice, and the State
5 of Washington are hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil
6 Rights Act of 1964.
