A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to make application for Referendum 26 Solid Waste grant funding from the Washington State Department of Ecology.

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1972, the voters of the State of Washington approved the sale of Referendum 26 Bonds for the use of the Washington State Department of Ecology as matching grants for the improvement and construction of solid waste facilities, and

WHEREAS, on July 28, 1976, the King County Council authorized the sale of general obligation bonds for the purpose of acquisition, construction, installation, and improvement of solid waste facilities, and the acquisition and purchase of solid waste equipment, and

WHEREAS, on October 4, 1976, the King County Council approved the King County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan which set forth the need for capital improvements to the solid waste system and presented a program for the orderly improvement of solid waste facilities and equipment, and

WHEREAS, on October 12, 1976, the King County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan was submitted to the Department of Ecology for their approval, and

WHEREAS, King County has met the requirements of the Department of Ecology for the application of Referendum 26 grant funding for solid waste facilities,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds to the Washington State Department of Ecology, Referendum 26, for the purpose of acquisition, construction, installation, and improvement of solid waste facilities, and the acquisition and purchase of solid waste equipment all of which shall be consistent with the King County Capital Improvement Program as referenced in Attachment A.

2. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such applications and contracts as are required by the grantor.

- 3. The King County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of such projects.
- 4. The State of Washington Department of Ecology is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
