MOTION NO. 02966

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A MOTION adopting the 1978 King County Law and Justice Plan, and authorizing the County Executive to submit the Plan and formal grant applications for all 1978 King County projects contained therein to the Washington State Law and Justice Planning Office.

WHEREAS, the State of Washington's Law and Justice Planning Office and the Governor's Committee on Law and Justice require that a regional plan be prepared and adopted by King County as a condition of King County's eligibility for the receipt of block grant funds made available to local governments under the provisions of the Crime Control Act of 1976, and

WHEREAS, the State Law and Justice Planning Office will reserve 1978 Part "C" block grant funds for local regions on the basis of a formula, and

WHEREAS, the 1978 King County Law and Justice Plan and project funding recommended by the King County Law and Justice Planning Committee best meets the needs of King County and participating suburban city governments given the fiscal constraint of an estimated \$565,000 FY 1978 funds available to King County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The King County Council hereby approves and adopts the 1978 King County Law and Justice Plan and authorizes the County Executive to submit said Plan and to submit formal grant applications for all King County projects contained therein to the Washington State Law and Justice Planning Office.

2. Following official notification of approval of the 1978 King County Law and Justice Plan by the Governor's Committee on Law and Justice and prior to the beginning of planned

1 activities, the Executive shall notify the Chairman of the  
2 Council, in writing, of any substantive changes in the approved  
3 document necessitated by action of the Governor's Committee.  
4 The Operations, Police and Judiciary Committee shall then discuss  
5 substantive changes in the Plan and, if deemed necessary, prepare  
6 a motion for Council approval authorizing program changes.

7 3. No funds shall be expended under the proposed jail  
8 design project until such time as the Council approves, by  
9 motion, the written results of the jail feasibility study  
10 requested of the Executive in Motion 2631.

11 4. No funds shall be expended on the proposed second year  
12 funding for the work release program until such time as the  
13 Council approves, by motion, the results of a study to:

14 A. Determine the extent to which the County's program,  
15 in coordination with DSHS, can serve as a transitional rehabil-  
16 itation facility for state prisoners projected to ultimately  
17 return to King County, and

18 B. Discuss and present conclusions to  
19 relevant administration, fiscal, judicial issues.
