2 A MOTION relating to continued funding of the  
3 drug abuse system in King County, stating  
4 County priorities should revenues for the  
5 system decline, stating County policy with  
6 regard to joint sponsorship with the City of  
7 Seattle of the Center for Addiction Services  
8 grant application, and satisfying the  
9 requirements of Ordinance 2988, Section  
10 46(3).

11 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle and King County are joint  
12 applicants for the National Institute of Drug Abuse (NIDA) grant,  
13 with King County maintaining administrative responsibility, and  
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15 WHEREAS, the Center for Addiction Services and its affiliate  
16 agencies provide drug services in King County, and  
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18 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle and King County provide  
19 financial support to be used as part of the local match for the  
20 NIDA grant, and  
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22 WHEREAS, the NIDA grant is based upon a predetermined ratio  
23 for declining federal/increasing local financial participation,  
24 and  
25

26 WHEREAS, it is likely that there will be continued  
27 reductions in the availability of resources for the provision of  
28 drug abuse service through the CAS drug abuse network, and  
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30 WHEREAS, each private nonprofit agency which subcontracts  
31 for these federal funds shares equally the responsibility for  
32 generating revenue from other sources, and  
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34 WHEREAS, each nonprofit agency has the further  
35 responsibility to commit a negotiated portion of revenue raised  
36 from other sources to provide the matching funds for the federal  
37 funds, and  
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39 WHEREAS, the geographic concentration of the drug using  
40 population changes as well as the mix of services required to  
41 meet the needs of the drug involved population, and  
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43 WHEREAS, the City and County recognize that local drug abuse  
44 problems are part of a nationwide problem, the solution of which  
45 will require a concerted effort by all levels of government as

1 entire categories of service must be eliminated, the Council  
2 intends that priority be given to the retention of the following  
3 service categories:

- 4 a. Prevention
- 5 b. Crisis Response
- 6 c. Service for the prescription drug abuser.

7 7. The Council recognizes that currently state money is  
8 focused on the serious narcotic abuser, but it is the intent of  
9 the King County Council to work for increased state financial  
10 support for the drug abuse system and for increased local  
11 flexibility in the utilization of state money.

12 8. With the passage of Motion 2814, relating to the 1977  
13 Annual Plan for Drug Abuse Services; Motion 2991, relating to the  
14 six year grant application for the Center for Addiction Services;  
15 and this motion, relating to future priorities for the drug abuse  
16 system, the Council finds that the conditions required in  
17 Ordinance 2988, Section 46(3), have been met.
