2 A MOTION declaring the support of the
3 King County Council for the establishment
4 of joint spheres of influence for land
5 use planning with the cities and towns
6 in King County.

7 WHEREAS, the land use decisions of King County
8 often have significant impact on the cities and towns within
9 King County, and

10 WHEREAS, the land use decisions of the cities and towns can
11 directly affect the area-wide planning objectives of King
12 County, and

13 WHEREAS, existing state enabling legislation does not
14 provide a clear method for delegating land use planning or
15 land development decision authority between cities, towns
16 and the County, and

17 WHEREAS, there is a need for an orderly planning program
18 to enable cities, towns and the County to avoid costly
19 interjurisdictional land use disputes and thereby making it
20 unnecessary to rely on the judicial process to resolve major
21 policy issues.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

23 The King County Council hereby declares its support for
24 the establishment of joint spheres of influence by cities,
25 towns and counties, within which local governments may mutually
26 delegate to each other, by interlocal agreement, review,
27 comment and/or decision-making responsibilities for land use
28 planning and land development decisions within their respective
29 jurisdictions.

The King County Subregional Council is requested to develop the spheres of influence concept into a workable program as an integral part of the Subregional Land Use Plan and to prepare, if necessary, state legislation for the 1978 Legislative Session to allow the program to be implemented.

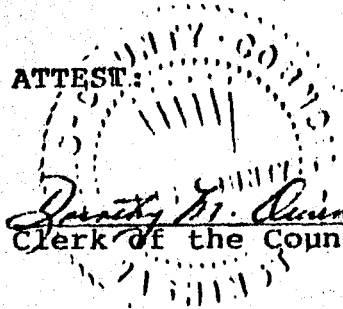
