A MOTION relating to paper recycling in King County offices and departments as a means of conserving energy and natural resources, and requesting the County Executive to prepare competitive bid specifications.

WHEREAS, the King County Council at its April 4, 1975 Policy Planning session requested the Policy Development Commission to develop proposed conservation proposals, and

WHEREAS, the Policy Development Commission on September 23, 1976 adopted the Ad Hoc Energy Conservation Committee's Report on Energy Conservation policies for King County and has presented it to the Council for its consideration, and

WHEREAS, by motion 2787, the King County Council adopted the Energy Conservation Policies on December 6, 1976 and is now considering an ordinance to adopt these policies as a part of the County's Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, the quality of life enjoyed by King County residents depends increasingly on the energy consequences of the choices we make through out public and private institutions, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council is interested in furthering and expanding the efforts being made towards energy and natural resource conservation, and,

WHEREAS, we have an opportunity to conserve our dwindling natural resources by implementing policies for paper recycling, and

WHEREAS, said policies would bring revenue into the County funds from selling waste paper to a broker, as opposed to expending funds for transportation and disposal of said waste paper, and

WHEREAS, paper recycling is working satisfactorily in other government agencies on federal, state and local levels, and

WHEREAS, an adjacent government agency has received monthly revenues averaging approximately one thousand dollars per month for the past three and one half years from the sale of waste paper to a broker, and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned agency recycled ninety-eight tons of paper in 1976, saving an equivalent of nearly one hundred acres of trees, and WHEREAS, a good example of energy conservation is set with the employees

and constituents if paper recycling is implemented, and

WHEREAS, paper recycling would help establish an energy conservation consciousness that would encourage employees to conserve energy in other ways by becoming more aware of the problems involved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Council requests that the County Executive prepare for paper recycling in King County offices and departments, for advertising for bidding and discuss such specifications with the King County Council no later than August 1, 1977.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED, the Council intends that King County offices and departments will be participating in paper reclamation for recycling by October 13, 1977.
