A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to make a grant application for funds in the approximate amount of \$321,460 from the HUD discretionary fund to restore damage caused by the December 1977, flood. Grant File No. 813.2.

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development has available a discretionary fund for the purpose of meeting emergency community development needs caused by federally recognized disasters; and,

WHEREAS, King County was declared a flood disaster area by President Carter on December 10, 1977, and the federally declared disaster period extended from December 1, to December 14, 1977; and,

WHEREAS, certain community development needs have been identified which are essential for the immediate restoration of community health, safety or economic stability; and,

WHEREAS, funds to meet these emergency needs cannot be provided under the Disaster Relief Act of 1974 or by other federal programs; and,

WHEREAS, the City Councils of the Cities of Issaquah and Snoqualmie have asked the County to seek funds for flood damage within their city limits; and,

WHEREAS, the Joint Policy Committee, acting for the King County Block Grant Consortium, has recommended that an application for HUD discretionary funds be submitted;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County;

- 1. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the approximate amount of \$321,460 to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the following projects, listed in order of priority:
- a. <u>Cedar River Bank Stabilization</u>: Repair of rip-rap on nine sections of the river bank along a sixteen mile stretch upstream from the City of Renton. Cost: \$24,360.

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- b. <u>Snoqualmie River Bank Stabilization</u>: Reinforcement of the river bank by rip-rapping a 1,190 foot stretch in the City of Snoqualmie where severe erosion occurred in the flood. Cost: \$107,100.
- c. <u>Issaquah Road Repair</u>: Repair of West Sunset Way in the City of Issaquah, where 900 feet of roadway was washed out, making one lane unusable. Cost: \$40,000.
- d. Greenwater River Bank Stabilization and Excess Gravel
 Removal: Reinforcement of the river bank by repairing
 rip-rapping; and removal of excess gravel deposited as a result
 of the December, 1977, flood, along a 1.5 mile stretch of the
 Greenwater River. Cost: \$150,000.
- 2. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor.
- 3. The King County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project.
- 4. The Department of Housing and Urban Development is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
