MOTION NO. 03479

A MOTION declaring the week of May 14, 1978 to May 21, 1978 as King County Bicycle Week.

WHEREAS, increasing concern for energy conservation, health and environmental amenities has contributed to the rediscovery of the bicycle for commuting purposes as well as for recreation purposes, and

WHEREAS, King County has demonstrated its intent to provide for the bicycling public by the adoption of the Urban Trails Plan in 1971, the General Bicycle Plan in 1976, and has actively pursued the implementation of these plans, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council passed Ordinance 3649 on April 3, 1978 amending the King County Comprehensive Plan relating to energy conservation, which included encouraging bicycle access to work, shopping, school and other daily activities by removing obstacles or improving facilities, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council passed Motion 3458 on April 17, 1978 requesting the County Executive to study the feasibility of establishing a coordinator for nonmotorized travel in the areas of bicycle, equestrian, pedestrain and water facilities travel, and

WHEREAS, private bicycling groups have scheduled several events for bicyclists during the week of May 14, 1978 to encourage bicycling for recreation and commuting, as shown on the attachment entitled, "Bicycle Week May 14-21".

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The week of May 14, 1978 to May 21, 1978 is hereby declared King County Bicycle Week.
