

MOTION NO. 03581

A MOTION requesting the County Executive to present to the Council in the 1979 budget proposal a plan to achieve an Executive recommendation by December 1, 1981 for appropriate energy generation/resource recovery from solid wastes generated in King County.

WHEREAS, the King County Council adopted policy to move toward energy/resource recovery from solid waste in 1974 by Motion 1539, and

WHEREAS, the County Council adopted the joint comprehensive management plan on September 20, 1976 by Ordinance 2913, involving 28 cities and towns in King County, which adopted a solid waste management policy on resource/energy recovery which states:

"Resource/energy recovery disposal systems should be the regional method of disposal. This system should maximize the recovery of materials and should be developed as soon as possible (underlining added) for implementation by 1981."

WHEREAS, the King County Council adopted energy conservation policies on December 6, 1976 by Motion 2787 and added these policies as a new amendment to the King County Comprehensive Plan by passage of Ordinance 3649 on April 3, 1978, and

WHEREAS, one of the County's Inter-Governmental Relations Policies for energy conservation is to "Support basic energy research and related demonstration projects in solar, wind, biomass (solar energy chemically stored in plant tissue formed through photosynthesis), geothermal and other nondepletable energy sources, as well as supporting the development of energy recovery from renewable energy sources found in solid wastes generated in all of King County," and

WHEREAS, all of King County now generates approximately 1.2 million tons of solid waste per year which needs disposal, and

WHEREAS, continuing technological changes in methods of manufacturing, packaging and marketing of consumer products, together with the economic and population growth of this county, the rising affluence of its citizens, and its expanding industrial

1 activity altogether have created new and increasing problems in-
2 volving disposal of garbage, refuse, and other solid waste
3 materials resulting from domestic, agricultural and industrial
4 activities, and

5 WHEREAS, there is a growing general public awareness of and
6 concern for the finiteness of our planet's depletable natural
7 resources, especially those fuels currently used for energy gen-
8 eration, such as petroleum compounds, natural gas, coal, and
9 uranium, and

10 WHEREAS, there are environment costs and economic costs which
11 must be adequately considered in developing additional energy
12 generation sources for King County, such as from atoms, (fission
13 and fusion), from solar radiation, wind, biomass, and hydro, from
14 tides, oceans (currents and temperature variations) and from geo-
15 thermal sources (dry and steam and hot brine), and

16 WHEREAS, the electrical energy demands of the Northwest
17 (Washington, Idaho, and Oregon) have been growing at an average
18 of 5.8% per year from 1964-1974, while the projected growth rates
19 are from an average low of 1.44% to an average high of 4.32% per
20 year for the years 1974 through 2000 according to the Northwest
21 Energy Policy Report, and

22 WHEREAS, present ultimate disposal facilities have a limited
23 remaining time for use with little opportunity to expand capaci-
24 ties and operations, and

25 WHEREAS, environmental legislation and regulations at all
26 levels and increasing public resistance are making it increasing-
27 ly difficult to site new final disposal facilities which will meet
28 the present high environmental standards, and

29 WHEREAS, because the work to develop an operational energy/
30 resource recovery operation most likely will span one decade, a
31 decision to begin now will relieve the pressure for a mandatory
32 decision in the early 1980's.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The County Executive is hereby requested to present to the Council in the 1979 budget proposal an activity, schedule and manpower plan with supporting funds to carry out the necessary study, coordination, public information and involvement which will lead to the Executive's proposal of a recommended plan for appropriate energy generation/resource recovery from solid wastes generated in King County by December 1, 1981. A status report shall be made to County Council by June 30, 1980 and June 30, 1981.
