A MOTION initiating a Newcastle Communities Plan and establishing the responsibilities of a Community Plan Committee and the King County Planning Division in developing a Newcastle Communities Plan and approving the appointment of citizens to serve on the Newcastle Communities Plan Committee.

WHEREAS, a Community Plan for Newcastle has previously been scheduled to commence in 1978, and

WHEREAS, preliminary study has been initiated by the Planning Division on the Newcastle Communities Plan, and

WHEREAS, a Communities Plan when adopted by the County Council represents an official development policy and community projects recommendation for a community, and

WHEREAS, a Communities Plan provides the link between general county-wide policies, plans and programs and specific implementation programs for a community, and

WHEREAS, a Communities Plan is intended to be utilized by other governmental agencies when making decisions concerning community development, and

WHEREAS, the King County Executive has recommended ten members and one alternate and the Councilpersons from Districts No. 6 and 9 have recommended ten members and two alternates to serve on the Newcastle Communities Plan Committee, including one representative each from the Planning Commissions of BeIlevue, Issaquah, and Renton,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: There is hereby established a twenty-one member Newcastle Communities Plan Committee, to be appointed subject to Council approval, as follows:

l. Ten (10) members and two (2) alternates to be appointed
by the Councilpersons from Districts No. 6 and 9;

3. A chairperson appointed by the Chairperson of the Policy Development Commission.

4. The appointed alternates shall serve in order named in the event a member is unable to complete his or her term.

5. There shall be three (3) alternates. If an alternate is appointed to committee membership or withdraws as an alternate, then the original appointer of the alternate shall appoint another alternate, subject to Council approval.

6. If a Committee member representing the cities of Bellevue, Renton or Issaquah is unable to complete his or her term, the city shall recommend another Planning Commissioner to serve on the Committee, subject to County Council approval.

7. All Committee members and alternates shall be subject to the disclosure provisions of K.C.C. 3.04.050.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED by the Council of King County: The Newcastle Communities Plan Committee shall:

1. Review and approve the development and execution of the community involvement process by the Community Involvement Coordinator assigned to the committee by the Policy Development

2. In cooperation with the Planning Division, propose and develop policies for guiding land use determinations for the location of residential, retail, commercial, industrial, agricultural and other appropriate activities. Adopted Communities Plans and the King County Comprehensive Plan shall be mutually consistent. Proposed policies, programs or map alternatives in the Communities Plan that are not consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan or other standards and official controls enacted by the County Council shall be presented and justified as recommended amendments to adopted County policies.

3. Consider the probable social, economic, and environmental impacts of the proposed policies, programs and map alternatives on the community and on the County as a whole. Such consideration shall include, but not be limited to, the cost and supply of housing and other development, utilities and other capital improvements, recreational facilities, and the procedures to implement proposed policies. The Committee shall consider at least one alternative and its probable impacts for each major policy proposed.

4. In cooperation with the Planning Division, develop and present maps illustrating the recommendations in the Communities Plan. Maps shall also be developed and presented to depict area zoning classifications which follow from the application of the recommended policies. The reason for all land use designations shall be stated.

5. Recommend a Communities Plan to the Council and Executive along with any recommended amendments to adopted County policies or regulations and any alternatives the Committee or the Planning Division may wish to include.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Planning Division shall:

1. Prepare preliminary community profiles which shall include inventories and analyses of: a) the social, economic, and natural environments of the study area; b) existing land use by type; c) transportation and utilities; and d) recreational and other public facilities. Using such inventories and analyses, the Planning Division shall estimate the community and regional needs under alternative growth and development concepts.

2. Prepare proposed policies, programs. and map altnernatives for Committee review and identify any inconsistent or unimplementable policies, programs and map alternatives under consideration.

3. Prepare a preliminary assessment of the social, environmental and economic impacts of proposed policies for each alternative growth and development concept under consideration. The assessment shall address the impact on the community and on the County as a whole.

4. Prepare maps illustrating the recommendations in the Communities Plan. These maps shall include depictions of the area zoning classifications necessary to apply the recommended land use policies. The rationale for all land use designations shall be stated.

5. Prepare preliminary and final Community Plan documents and the Environmental Impact Statement.
