A MOTION adopting the 1979 Drug Abuse Plan, and authorizing the Executive to transmit it to the State of Washington.

WHEREAS, state grant-in-aid funds are provided to King
County to support a program of rehabilitation for those persons
suffering from problems related to drugs, and

WHEREAS, county receipt of state funds is contingent upon review and approval by the Department of Social and Health Services of an annual plan for services, and

WHEREAS, the Drug Commission has recommended to the County Council the 1979 Drug Abuse Plan which contains policies for the expenditures of state grant-in-aid funds, and

WHEREAS, the 1979 Plan differs substantially from the 1978
Plan in that the 1978 Plan also contained policies for the
expenditure of federal funds granted by the National Institute on
Drug Abuse (NIDA), and

WHEREAS, during 1978, NIDA has refused to honor the policy decisions contained in the 1978 Plan and subsequent Council motions, especially Motion 3722, and has withdrawn its grant from the county, and

WHEREAS, NIDA now is contracting directly with treatment agencies and has used moneys formerly allocated to King County for administration to increase revenues to the agencies, and

WHEREAS, the County Council still believes that the policies adopted in Motion 3722 provide the proper framework for administering the drug treatment system, and

WHEREAS, future county administration, in any form, of the NIDA grant would have to include a substantial increase in federal support, resolution of the deficit issues associated with previous years' administration, community based control of the program, and central intake processes to insure accountability.
