

MOTION NO. 4065

2 A MOTION authorizing the Executive to sign an
3 application to the Law Enforcement Assistance
4 Administration for a \$460,562 grant including
5 local match, for an Integrated Criminal
Apprehension Program (ICAP) Patrol Management
Project to be operated by the Department of
Public Safety.

6 WHEREAS, King County has a policy of improving the
7 productivity of County personnel, and

8 WHEREAS, King County has a policy of testing new programs to
9 improve the effectiveness and efficiency of patrol manpower, and

10 WHEREAS, Law Enforcement Assistance Administration
11 discretionary grant funds are available to the Department of
12 Public Safety to operate a program to improve the use and
13 allocation of patrol manpower.

14 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

15 The County Executive is hereby authorized to sign an
16 application to LEAA for \$460,562, inclusive of local match, for
17 the Ingegrated Criminal Apprehension Program Patrol Management
18 Project; PROVIDED THAT:

19 1. The Department of Public Safety shall submit status
20 reports to the Council Administrator-Clerk as to the degree in
21 which the department has accomplished the stated Project
22 Schedule, contained in the Management Plan of the application.
23 Deviations from the schedule, the rationale and impact on the
24 program shall be narratively defined. The first report shall be
25 due by October 15, 1979, and at six month intervals thereafter.

26 2. The ongoing management monitoring and evaluation
27 processes of this project shall be so constructed as to
28 demonstrate over time:

29 a. The ideal level of personnel manpower available,
30 civilian and commissioned, defined in such terms and consistent
31 time frames (i.e., hours which can be related to costs, to
32 discrete organizational elements) as can be monitored on a
33 continuing basis; versus

1 b. Defined policy or management situations which result in
2 like identified personnel being unavailable for duty or service;
3 therefore

4 c. A monitoring and evaluation process which defines
5 benefits of the program in terms of total personnel positions
6 authorized as compared to actual numbers of personnel whose
7 functions and performance are being evaluated.

8 3. In addition to previously stated management monitoring
9 and evaluation requirements, the process shall specifically
10 define costs of implementing the program to increase the
11 apprehension and conviction of serious or repeat offenders. The
12 department will specifically identify costs, and where drawn from
13 on a continuing basis, which represent net additions in resources
14 to serve this function above planned levels.
