## MOTION NO. 0004505

A MOTION directing the Executive Administration to identify an alternative site for the County's Work-Education Release Program in addition to the Immigration and Naturalization Building.

WHEREAS, the problem of overcrowding in the present King County Jail is a serious problem, needing a timely solution, and

WHEREAS, the County Council supports the Executive
Administration's intention to seek solutions to the present jail
overcrowding, and

WHEREAS, the Work-Education Release Program is considered by many public officials and experts in the criminal rehabilitation field to be a positive, constructive, and effective means to reduce present jail overcrowding, and

WHEREAS, many citizens of the International District of
Seattle strongly oppose the placement of the County WorkEducation Release Program in any portion of the Federal
Immigration and Naturalization Building, due to fear of incidents
of crime that may be committed, and to potential decline of
business investments and improvements, and

WHEREAS, the International District community was not included in the planning process for County use of the Immigration and Naturalization Building for work release, and

WHEREAS, the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, dealing with the County use of the Immigration and Naturalization Building, issued August 10, 1979, concedes that it is impossible to obtain data to either prove or reject the negative predictions, as there are no truly comparable data pertaining to a local Work-Education Release Program of similar site and nature as proposed, and

WHEREAS, the Draft Environmental Impact Statement also concedes that predictions are impossible to make pertaining to the negative impacts because there are no communities with the same set of unique qualities exhibited by the Seattle

International District, and

WHEREAS, the Draft Environmental Impact Statement reveals that siting in another building other than the Immigration and Naturalization Building would have little or no impact on the time availability schedule for a site to house the Work-Education Release Program.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

No firm commitments be made by the County regarding any Work Release site until the Council is satisfied that the affected community has been involved in the discussion of the program in that location and their major concerns have been addressed, based on:

- 1. Quantitative studies leading to objective conclusions showing that:
- a. There will be no appreciable decline of business or public investment in what has been legally defined as a unique social and cultural area, and
- b. There will be no meaningful conflict with planned public investments, goals, and objectives regarding issues of housing, economic, and community development.
- 2. Studies have been performed, and reviewed by the affected community offering evidence as to predictable positive outcomes of such a program based on comparison to other like programs, to the extend feasible.'
- 3. As an alternative, the administration should expeditiously begin a process to actively and aggressively explore and identify alternative sites for an expanded program; PROVIDED, that upon developing alternative sites the administration shall work in concert with the affected jurisdiction to insure a timely opportunity for community participation and input prior to any future action by the Council.

PROVIDED, that the Council acknowledge the intensive efforts of the Administration in attempting to locate a facility for an expanded Work-Education Program, but it is the policy of the Council that the interests of King County and the affected community would best be served by fully exploring alternative sites rather than committing only to the Immigration and Naturalization Building.
