2 A MOTION concurring with the King County Executive's
3 allocation of \$9,000 of the historic preservation
4 block grant funds for the relocation of the Muckleshoot
5 Old Mission Church. The historic preservation block
6 grant funds were previously appropriated under the
7 1979 Housing & Community Development Block Grant Program.

8 WHEREAS, the King County Council has, through Ordinance 2991,
9 adopted the goal of preserving and selectively encouraging the
10 restoration of buildings, sites and areas that depict the
11 evolution of King County, and

12 WHEREAS, the King County Council has, through Ordinance 4112,
13 authorized the expenditure of \$59,000 in 1979 Housing & Community
14 Block Grant Funds for historic preservation projects, and

15 WHEREAS, a committee of citizens representing the disciplines
16 of History, Architectural History, Musology and Historic Preser-
17 vation, appointed by the King County Executive, has reviewed
18 project proposals based on published criteria and has identified
19 the relocation of the Muckleshoot Old Mission Church as a project
20 of highest priority for County grant assistance, and

21 WHEREAS, the Association of King County Historic Organiza-
22 tions has, by motion, recommended that \$9,000 of the historic
23 preservation block grant funds be allocated for the relocation
24 of the Muckleshoot Church, and

25 WHEREAS, the County Executive has reviewed and concurs with
26 above recommendations;
