MOTION NO. 4683

A MOTION certifying the consistency of the Issaquah Creek Interceptor Sections 1 and 2 with County Land Use Plans and Policies.

WHEREAS, Metro Council Resolution No. 2933 requires King County certification that extensions of Metro Interceptors are consistent with King County Land Use Plans and Policies, and

WHEREAS, Metro estimates that the Issaquah Creek Interceptor has the capacity to serve approximately 3200 acres outside the city limits of Issaquah, and

WHEREAS, the Sunset and Heathfield pumping stations and the Eastgate Trunk are presently operating beyond their design capacities, and

WHEREAS, the capacity of the proposed Issaquah Interceptor cannot be utilized until or unless the capacities of the Sunset and Heathfield pumping stations and the Eastgate Trunk are expanded, and

WHEREAS, according to Metro, the capacities of the Sunset and Heathfield pumping stations and the Eastgate Trunk probably will not be expanded until 1982, and

WHEREAS, the King County Sewerage General Plan establishes those areas of King County which may be served by sewers, and

WHEREAS, King County is presently involved in Community Planning processes for the East Sammamish, Newcastle, and Tahoma Communities which may modify the Local Service Area of the Sewerage General Plan and utilize portions of the capacity of the Issaquah Interceptor.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:


1 The Metro Issaquah Creek Interceptor Phase 1 and 2 is
2 hereby certified as consistent with King County Land Use Plans
3 and Policies, PROVIDED the sewer service by this Interceptor is
4 limited to areas designated Local Service Area by the king
5 County Sewerage General Plan as now or hereafter amended.
