## MOTION NO. 5119

A MOTION relating to the King County Jail; directing the Executive to take emergency action to relieve overcrowding in the facility; directing the Executive to enter into contract with the Second Chance, Inc. program to house a minimum of one hundred and sixty appropriate prisoners at the program's facility at the Washington Center Building.

WHEREAS, the Council approved Motion 5110, December 15, 1980, and

WHEREAS, Motion 5110 stated that overcrowding in the King County Jail constituted an emergency crisis, and

WHEREAS, Motion 5110 authorized the Executive, under appropriate powers provided in K.C.C. 4.16, to sign a contract with a bidder for, at a minimum, the housing of the existing work-release population, now maintained in the King County Jail, and

WHEREAS, the intent of Motion 5110 was to relieve overcrowding in the current facility thereby allowing for a general decrease in the population and the added ability of jail staff to isolate mentally ill population from the general jail population; and

WHEREAS, the Second Chance, Inc. program operates a minimum detention-work release facility at the Washington Center Building, located at 1421 Minor Avenue in Seattle, and

WHEREAS, the Second Chance program currently operates a work release program at the site by virtue of a contract with DSHS, and

WHEREAS, staff of the Second Chance program has stated that their agency could accept one hundred and sixty appropriate prisoners at their Washington Center Building facility, immediately, and

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WHEREAS, the current number of budgeted work release slots or beds in the King County Jail is one hundred and thirty-nine, and

WHEREAS, the Second Chance, Inc., work release program located at the Washington Center Building is currently being operated in violation of City of Seattle zoning codes, and

WHEREAS, representatives of the program are attempting to resolve zoning violations in cooperation with the City of Seattle, and

WHEREAS, representatives of the program have stated, in writing, that they would house appropriate prisoners at the agency's Washington Center facility and by contract hold King County legally harmless from any future actions by the City of Seattle regarding zoning issues, and

WHEREAS, relieving the jail overcrowding is an emergency which must be resolved immediately,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

Under the provisions of Motion 5110 and K.C.C. 4.16, the Executive is directed to immediately enter into negotiations with the Second Chance, Inc., for the immediate transfer of up to one hundred and sixty appropriate prisoners out of the King County jail to that program's facility located in the Washington Center Building.
