

MOTION NO. 5321

A MOTION relating to planning; endorsing
in principle the King Subregional Plan

WHEREAS, the King Subregional Council of the Puget Sound Council of
Governments adopted the King Subregional Plan on December 14, 1978, and

WHEREAS, King County is a member of the King Subregional Council of the
Puget Sound Council of Governments, and

WHEREAS, the King Subregional Council's member jurisdictions have
developed a Subregional Plan for guidance of local land use, transportation,
utility planning and intergovernmental coordination, and

WHEREAS, the Subregional Plan sets out a policy framework for achieving
phased and managed growth of the Puget Sound Region which will conserve
environmental resources, amenities, energy and tax monies and make more
efficient use of public investment in existing facilities, and

WHEREAS, King County is now considering adoption of a General Development
Guide as a major update and replacement of its 1964 Comprehensive Plan and
its amendments, and

WHEREAS, the King Subregional Plan is the basis for conducting planning,
coordination and project review functions of the King Subregional Council.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The King County Council endorses in principle the purposes, goals
and policy direction of the King Subregional Plan as summarized in Attachment
A of this Motion.


2. Upon adoption of the General Development Guide, King County will:

A. Consider endorsing the King Subregional Plan in its entirety,
in order for it to be: 1) considered when reviewing major land use changes
within unincorporated King County; 2) used in reviewing environmental impacts
of project proposals; 3) considered in combination with other policies when
making planning and policy decisions; and 4) taken by King County as a
framework by which to review with other governments, land use, utility and
transportation planning decisions of an intergovernmental nature; and


B. Consider designating activity centers for the purposes of implementing the General Development Guide and the King Subregional Plan by establishing priority areas for the concentration of employment growth and the allocation of transportation funding.
