A MOTION proclaiming July 2 as Redondo Day in King County in honor of the opening of the Redondo Waterfront Park.

WHEREAS, King County's new Redondo Waterfront Park will be dedicated in ceremonies July 2, 1982, and

WHEREAS, the people of Redondo have worked long and hard to make the new park a reality, and

WHEREAS, their efforts have displayed community spirit and pride that should serve as an example to others, and

WHEREAS, the town of Redondo has a long and colorful history dating back to Captain George Vancouver's exploration of the area in 1792, and

WHEREAS, the Stone family established the first homestead in the area and named the town Stone's Landing, and

WHEREAS, Stone's Landing was renamed Redondo in 1907, and has long been a popular resort, and recreation area, and

WHEREAS, the new county park will provide 325 feet of waterfront on Puget Sound for recreation and the only public boat launch ramp on the Sound from Seattle to Tacoma, and

WHEREAS, the Auburn and Federal Way Post offices will issue a commemorative envelope and postmark in honor of the park's opening, and

WHEREAS, the dedication ceremony will kickoff a series of community events in Redondo, including a Fourth of July fireworks display at the waterfront park, and
