MOTION NO. - 5537

A MOTION expressing the acceptance by the King County Council of the Farmlands Implementation Task Force recommendations to fund the Farm and Open Space Preservation Program and requesting the King County Executive and King County Prosecutor to take certain actions required to implement the recommendations.

WHEREAS, on June 18, 1979, the King County Council enacted Ordinance 4341 calling for an election of the voters of the County to authorize issuing fifty million dollars of general obligation bonds to provide funds for the purchase of voluntarily offered intersts in Farm and Open Space land; and

WHEREAS, in November, 1979, the voters of King County approved a fifty million dollar bond issue for the acquisition of voluntarily offered interests in farms and open space land in King County pursuant to Ordinance 4341; and

WHEREAS, King County has been unable to sell the bonds authorized by Ordinance 4341 at or under the eight percent per annum interest rate permitted by law; and

WHEREAS, concerted and committed action is needed immediately to implement the Farm and Open Space Program in order to: (1) complete the Program within its remaining three years of authorization; (2) reduce the uncertainty which delay in the implementation of the Program has created in the farming community regarding King County's real commitment to and support of agriculture; and (3) commence the program before any prospective improvement in the regional economy re-introduces the pressures that have historically led to increased property acquisition costs and to farmland conversion; and

WHEREAS, a nine member citizen's Farmland Implementation Task Force has developed and published a set of recommendations in a report entitled <u>Preserving Farmlands and Open Space</u>, dated July, 1982, which proposed funding and implementation mechanisms consistent with the objectives and limitations of Ordinance 4341; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force presented its recommendations to the King County Council and the King County Executive on July 23, 1982, and the recommendations have been carefully considered by the Council; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council concurs with the three major criteria in the Task Force report that the financing recommendations used must achieve the

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intent of ordinance 4341 in quality and quantity of land served, remain within the spirit of the fiscal constraints of the Farm and Open Space Preservation Program, and provide for timely implementation of the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

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A. The King County Council acknowledges receipt of the major recommendations for funding the Farm and Open Space Preservation Program contained in the Farmlands Implementation Task Force Report and requests:

(1) The King County Executive include in the proposed 1983 levy ordinance a provision to issue a Conservation Futures Tax, authorized by Revised Code of Washington(RCW) 84.34.230, to pay the 1983 principal and interest due on the Councilmanic bonds authorized by Ordinance [Proposed Ordinance 82-443].

(2) The King County Executive complete the required steps and transmit to the King County Council the necessary ordinance(s) by December 15, 1982, in order that the proposed Mutual Fund financing mechanism can be considered and acted upon by the County Council in time for its use in selection round 3, as described in King County Ordinance 4341, by January 30, 1983.

(3) The King County Executive and the King County Prosecuting Attorney complete the required steps and transmit to the King County Council by September 1, 1982, the necessary ordinance(s) for Council review and action in time for commencing a declaratory judgment action by October 15, 1982 to determine the legality of issuing Hybrid Bonds as described in the Task Force Report.

B. The King County Council recommends that the King County Executive continue developing techniques for funding the Farm and Open Space Program authorized by Ordinance 4341, including the transmittal of the necessary ordinance(s) to the King County Council to revise and update authorization for the issuance of General Obligation bonds in an amount compatible with the fiscal constraints of the original authorization less the amount

2	C. The King County Council recommends that the King County
3	Executive continue to pursue establishing Interlocal Agreements
. 4	with cities within or near Agricultural Districts to encourage
5	the preservation of farmlands within their spheres of influence.
6:	D. The King County Council accepts the Task Force Report
7	recommendations and intends to limit the King County funds
8	allocated to purchase property interest to an amount compatible
9	with the fiscal constraints described in Ordinance 4341 for the
10	purpose of preserving farmlands and open space on the land
11	identified in Ordinance 4341.
